13300-1 ROBERT ALVA JAMISON, was born April 21, 1852, Butler co., PA. He died October 18, 1918, Canton, OH. Mr. Jamison married September 1, 1887, Pittsburgh, Allegheny co., PA, Clarissa{Clara} **Meals**, born March 7, 1856, possibly at North Washington, PA, the widow of James **French**. She died December 29, 1943, Waynesburg, Greene co., PA.

Mr. Jamison worked for State Electric Company of Canton, OH. Only been on the job for two weeks, he was making a final inspection of the lighting system when he fell 60 feet from the skylight of the First Christian Church where he was doing repairs. Dr. **Buchman** was the attending physician, but said death was instantaneous. He was taken to Miller-Blanchard Funeral Home. He resided at 2812 Second Street, Canton. His funeral was held on a Monday, 10 am. Rev. George E. **Jackson** officiated at the burial conducted at Westlawn Cemetery.

James French died shortly after Clara and he were married. Mr. & Mrs. Coffey had a daughter, Helen Coffey **Hartlieb** of Wheeling, WV. They had daughters, Elaine Harlieb **Butler** of Edmonton, Alberta, Canada. And Jane Hartlieb and a son William A. of Charleston, WV.

Mr. Jamison's uncle, Samuel Meals, was an official with the Carnegie Gas Corp, a subsidiary of U. S. Steel. Jamison's family moved to Mannington, WV as oil and gas drilling started there. From there they moved in 1901 to Waynesburg. As a small boy he recalls carrying the gloves of the Waynesburg star players of the day such as "Pop" **Shriver**, Jimmy **Ganiear**, and "Hooker" **Phillips** who went on into professional baseball. Mr. Jamison was one of Greene county's best sandlot baseball players playing in Pennsylvania. He was offered tryouts in the former Central League team at Wheeling, WV which was affiliated with the Pittsburgh Privates. He played third base and was a life-long enthusiast even managing a number of the local teams. He was employed by J. B. Flowers Corp, an oil and gas firm.

Mr. Jamison spent his early life in Waynesburg, PA then spent 27 years in Washington, D.C. before removing to Morgantown, WV in 1983. A member of the First Presbyterian Church of Waynesburg, he graduated in 1937 from Waynesburg High School. Four years later he graduated from Waynesburg College. He served in World War II with the U. S. Air Force in Panama. He was a pilot and pilot instructor in both Waynesburg and Morgantown. Mr. Jamison was employed by the Federal Aviation Administration in D.C. as chief of the projects development branch. He retired in 1983.
