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NOTES:

I am indebted to many people on the information and content of this genealogy. Henry Jamison's family and descendants are many, spanning the centuries as well as the miles across the gulfs of time and the vast regions of the United States. While I have researched a great deal of this myself, there are those whose names I must recite in order to give credit to all: Charles V. Jamison Sr. of Royalton, Ohio; Ruth Jamison of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma(deceased) *(1); Chris Garst of Webber, Kansas; Lurene Claycamp of Soldier, Kansas; Joseph Cotton of Valley City, Utah; and Milo J. Cumpston of Fayetteville, Arkansas. These people I have mentioned in passing for their contributions to this rapidly and prolifically growing family. While some have provided more material than others each has added invaluably to the store of genealogical lore. A special and huge note of thanks goes to Charlie Jamison of Roylaton, OH. whose hard work and dedication to turning over so many stones on his family has provided much of the material for the generations of Jamisons out in Greene co., PA

and Monongalia county, WV. His dedication, exceptionally positive attitude, and hard work has brought about a history that displays the very characters of his own family.

HENRY JAMISON OF BUCKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

Notes:

Mr. Jamison emigrated from Leith, Midlothian, Scotland at an early age to Ulster, Ireland[1]. Whether he came in company with his parents or with others is unknown, presently. Tradition apparently tells us also that Henry was the son of William Jamison, "a rigid Presbyterian, and a zealous supporter of the "Solemn League and Covenant". Taking his family he left Scotland in 1685 and settled in Omagh, County Tyrone, Ireland, though this appears to negate additional information from Rev. Jameson's book that states, "They were of Scotch descent; their ancestors were of a colony from Argyleshire, Scotland, who crossed over and settled in the north of Ireland"[1]. E. O. Jameson also comments that William Jameson was at the seige of Londonderry

and "served with such gallantry that subsequently he was freed from all taxation by order of King William" [1]. Tradition, based on Rev. Jameson's book and the information he has concerning William Jamison is provided in the tree below.

Mr. Jamison with his wife, Jane, and children, Robert, Henry, Alexander, and Ann and her husband, William Miller Jr., emigrated some time between 1718-1722 to Philadelphia. While no emigration records record this fact, circumstances such as the emigration of his brothers (2), William and John Jamison to Boston in 1718, along with Robert Jamison showing up the following year in Ipswich, MA., bear an influence as to when Henry Jamison may have come over. Certainly, the traditional 1708 or after is no where near correct and the purchasing of land in 1724 would conclude more adequately that the 1718-1720 time period be more precise. On June 6, 1724, Henry and wife, Jane, were communicants of the Presbyterian church at Abbington, Bucks co., PA[2]. This information was also recorded at the Dutch Reformed Church in Bensalem, Bucks co., PA[3] and may have been so recorded because of a lack of a place for whorship in Warwick at the time. In the same year Jamison purchased a thousand acres of land half of which lay in Northampton and the other in Warwick from Jeremiah Langhorne February 27, 1724. This acreage was part of 5,000 acres which Penn's commissioners conveyed to Benjamin Hurley Sept. 13, 1703 and he in turned sold it to another and has passed down to Henry Jamison. He also purchased May 7, 1728 from Jeremiah Langhorne 200 acres of land which he willed to his son, Henry Jamison Jr. in 1734. Three years later he became one of the founders and trustees of "Neshaminy" Presbyterian Church, taken from an Indian word meaning, "at the double drinking place". The first Minister was a converted Anglican (Episcopal) by the name, William Tennent, who with his wife, Catherine nee **Kennedy**, emigrated in 1718 from Scotland to Philadelphia and made his way to Bensalem, Bucks county in 1726. The following year Rev. Tennent traveled three miles up the Neshaminy Creek to the forks where about 200 souls had settled. On February 13, 1733 the town of Middlebury was established by the congregation, signed by seventeen of its foremost men, three of whom were Robert, Henry, and Alexander Jamison. In 1736 the town's name by petition was changed to Warwick, Pa. In a land deed dated 1734, Henry Jamison Sr. conveyed his Bucks county home to his sons, Robert receiving 250 acres and the homestead, and the balanced divided equally among the others. Robert Jamison accompanied his father, Henry, to Ireland, but returned without his father the following year.

The surname is sometimes spelt: Jemyson; Jemison; Jameson.

Notes:

Henry Jamison received from his father's will 200 acres of land January 7, 1734, which he conveyed to his son, Robert Jamison in 1765. In 1759 he was listed on the Warwick tax rolls for 8 sheep at 33 shillings. A prominent man in the community and large land owner he made his will April 18, 1765 in which he writes about his being about to incur "...the danger of the seas..." sailing to Florida soon after and was never heard from again. His will was probated April 14, 1766, and he was assumed "lost at sea".

Mary Stewart was a sister of John Stewart, who, in conjunction with Henry Jamison Jr. purchase considerable land in Warwick.

Robert Jamison in 1734 sailed to Tyrone Co., Ireland with his father, Henry, just after his father bequeath to him 250 acres in Warwick, PA. He returned to Bucks county, Pennsylvania, though a record comes to light in which "Robert Jamison witnessed a Power of Attorney by William **Witherington** of Kilcaddy, parish of Clogher, County of Tyrone, Ireland" dated August 6, 1743. This instrument was made before John **Rennick**, a notary public and proved March 16, 1744 by Jamison in Bucks co., PA[5]. It is unknown to what this applied, though possibly made in order to effectively handle his father's affairs in that country at his death which may have occurred about 1743. Mr. Jamison was taxed in Warwick in 1759 at the rate of 12 shillings for 3 sheep. In 1760 he is listed with 2 horses, 6 cattle, 10 sheep and 1 household servant at the rate of 3 pounds, 16 shillings, and 8 pence.

Robert Jamison was intimately involved with his community. He served as overseer of the roads in Warwick, as an Elder in the Neshaminy Presbyterian Church, and as a Captain in the colonial militia.

In the History of Neshaminy[5] Mr. Jamison along with his brother, Henry Jamison Jr., on July 1, 1743 were made trustees of two acres of land in Warwick, PA. for the erection of a church along side the Creek. He received from his father 250 acres of land October 27, 1729. Mr. Jamison's will was dated 1747 and proved in 1749. He bequeathed the homestead to his son, Robert Jamison.

- William Jamison(26541), single man, resided until 1759 in his uncle Robert Jamison's(26511) household. He was listed in the Warwick tax lists for 1753 owing 4 shilling, 6 pence[1].

- John Jamison taxed 1759 at his father's[1].

Notes:

Captain Henry Darrah was the son of Thomas and Mary Darrah, an Irish-Scotchman, emigrated to the America in 1725 settling at Neshaminy Valley in Bucks co., Pa. His father, Thomas, was the founder of Log College, which later became the College of New Jersey, and finally named Princeton University. He was also the founder of the Neshaminy Presbyterian Church of Warwick, PA. and of Deep Run Presbyterian Church in Bedminster, PA. Mr. Thomas Darrah died in March of 1750 leaving five sons who were all involved with the colonial side during the American Revolution. Capt. Darrah was educated and a fine horseman. Family tradition indicates that Henry Jamison was completely against the marriage of his daughter, Ann, saying "that young Darrah was too fond of fast horses and not fond enough of making a living tilling the soil"*⁽³⁾. The matter apparently was settled when Henry and Ann got on one of the horses and outrode her pursuing father. They resided in New Britain township where in 1775 Mr. Darrah was appointed an Associator. In the following year he was appointed 1st Lt. of Captain William **Robert**'s Company and on organizing of the "Flying Camp" appointed in 1776 by the bucks county Committee of Safety, later serving in the New Jersey and Long Island campaigns. Commissioned a Captain on May 6, 1777 he served variously under Colonels John Lacey and William Roberts.

- James Darrah, eldest son of Henry and Ann Darrah purchased in 1789 170 acres of the homestead tract in New Britain. He bought in 1794 his wife's sister's homestead in Warminster, near Hartsville, and settled there for the remainder of his life. When he died he was buried at Neshaminy church, bucks co., PA. He was a trustee of the church in 1795; treasurer from 1812-14; and collector of pew rents, 1807. His wife, Rachel Henderson, was born July 27, 1762, Warminster, PA., was a daughter of Robert and Margaret (**Archibald**) Henderson, both of Scots-Irish lineages. Mrs. Darrah died March 17, 1802 and Mr. James Darrah married Rebecca **McCrea**. Two children only from his first wife, Rachel, were Robert and Henry Darrah.

- Robert Darrah, son of James and Rachel (Henderson) Darrah, was born February 8, 1789, New Britain, Bucks co., PA. He died August 5, 1860. Served in the War of 1812 under Captain Joseph Vandyck's company in the 48th Regiment, Volunteer Artillery. He married September 4, 1819, Catherine Galt(Gault) born 1/26/1799, Salisbury, Lancaster co., PA., died 1890, Warminster, PA., the daughter of James and Mary (Martin) Galt, a great-great-grand daughter of Robert Galt, who, reportedly, was the first white man to settle in the Pequea Valley of Lancaster county. Mr. Darrah inherited his father's estate in Warminster(the old Henderson plantation) which he improved considerably. They had nine children: Rev. James Darrah, Princeton, 1840, Bucks county bar, 1843, and Yale College, 1846, was pastor of the Philadelphia Pa., Presbyterian Church and at St. Louis Presbyterian, Missouri; John M. Darrah, hartsvile, PA; Robert Henderson Darrah, Warminster, PA; Rachel H. Darrah and Rebecca Darrah, both of whom were successively wives of Rev. Douglass K. Turner, pastor of Neshaminy Church and author of the History of the Neshaminy church; Eliza M.; Emily; Mary A.; and Katherine.

Mr. Jamison was listed in the Warwick tax lists for 1759 and 60. In 1759 he was listed under his father's household and in 1760 was taxed at 8 pounds, 8 shillings for his grist mill which stood on 48 acres of land with a rent of 14 pounds per annum, 3 horses, 3 cattle, and 8 sheep.

Mr. Jamison was the executor of his father's will, 1766. After administering his father's will he sold the estate he inherited in 1777 and removed to Middletown, Dauphin county, PA. Here he purchased March 6, 1778, a house and two lots from Albright **Swinefind** and sold them February 22, 1779 for 600 pounds to brothers, William and Thomas **Crabb**. In that year he went further west and settled in Georges township, Fayette co., PA. In Georges he secured a patent on 277 and a half acres of land on a fork of woods laying between Union township and Cheat River, but this he sold and settled in Dunkard township, Greene county, PA. where he died. Alexander Jamison was a member of the Associated Company of Warwick and later in the militia during the Revolution along with his brother, William Jamison.

His will was dated May 23, 1807 and probated August 26, 1812. He mentioned wife, Isabella, and children: William, Henry, Rebecka, Eleanor, Anne, Mary, and Martha; executors: sons, Henry and William Jamison; witnesses: John **Flenniken**, deceased, and Josias **Lowery**.

Henry Jamison was born in November of 1766, Bucks co., PA. He died April 12, 1834, Cumberland, Greene co., PA. He may never have been married because his will, dated April 5, 1833 and probated May 14, 1834, names his immediate family only. He mentions sisters, Mary Jamison, Rebecca Jamison, Helen{Eleanor} Davis, Martha Stephenson, and Ann Scudder as heirs. He also names his father, Alexander Jamison, and brother, William Jamison, nephew, Henry Jamison, and neice, Mary Jamison. Executor was

Henry Jamison, his nephew. Witnesses were: William Flenniken, and William P. Jamison. (4)

Mr. Jamison received ten shillings from his father's will, dated April 18, 1765, and proved April 14, 1766. However, William appears to have had a loan from his father since 60 pounds were to be returned to his brother, John Jamison. Mr. Jamison, like his brother, Alexander, was a member of the Associated Company of Warwick and later a part of the Bucks county militia. Mr. Jamison may have left Warwick, PA. near the same time as his brother, Alexander Jamison, but not after 1783, when his first child, John Jamison, was born on August 12, 1783, in Greene co., Pa. out on the western frontier. He received a land patent of 420 acres in Dunkard, PA. for 120 pounds as follows:

Thos M'Kean (L.S.) The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

To all To Whom These Presents Shall Come, Greeting:

Know Ye that in consideration of the monies paid by William Jamison of Greene County into the Receiver-Generale Office of this Commonwealth, at the granting of the warrant hereinafter mentioned, and of the sum of ten dollars and sixty three cents lawful money now paid by him into the said Office, there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto the said William Jamison a certain tract of land, called "Chester" Situate in Dunkard township Greene County BEGINNING at a sugar tree thence by land of Joseph Morris north seventy eight degrees and three quarters east one hundred and sixty nine perches to a white oak thence by land of Robert Montgomery south sixty four degrees east forty four perches to a hickory south sixty seven degrees and a half east fifty six perches to a white oak, thence by land of Benegah Guston south twenty three degrees east two hundred and twenty perches to a poplar thence by land of Samuel Guston south seventeen degrees east one hundred and seventeen perches to a white oak thence by land of Jacob Fost and Jeremiah Guston south sixty two degrees west one hundred and eighty perches to a white oak north seventy four degrees west sixty perches to a white oak thence by land of Samuel Updegreve north twenty degrees east two hundred and forty perches to a black oak north seventy degrees west two hundred and twenty five perches to a white oak and thence by land of John Bell north twenty three west one hundred perches to the beginning, CONTAINING four hundred twenty acres one hundred twenty perches and allowance of six per cent for roads, &0 which said tract was surveyed in pursuance of a warrant dated the 30th of March 1796 granted to the said William Jamison with the appurtenances.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, the said Tract or Parcel of Land, with the appurtenances, unto the said William Jamison and his heirs, to the use of him the said William Jamison his heirs and assigns forever.

FREE AND CLEAR, of all Restrictions and Reservations, as to Mines, Royalties, Quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth part of all Gold and Silver Ore for the use of this Commonwealth, to be delivered at the Pit's mouth, clear of all charges.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF Thomas M'Kean Governor of the said Commonwealth, hath hereunto set his hand and caused the State Seal to be hereunto affixed, the twenty seventh day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and five and of the Commonwealth the thirtieth.

He was buried at Garrard's Fort Goshen Cemetery in Greene co., PA. and he and his family resided in Dunkard township. William owned 10 acres of a tract along Meadow Run which he left for his son, John Jamison.

William Jamison's will was dated 1810 and proved January 24, 1819, Greene co., PA. In it he writes:

"In the Name of God Amen, I William Jamison of Dunkard township in Greene county in the State and province of Pennsylvania being in health of body and of sound disposing memory & judgment do make and ordain this my testament & last will - I will & order all my just debts and funeral expences to be paid out of my estate I will and bequeath unto my wife Nancy Jamison one third part of the yearly incourse of my real estate during her natural life also one third part of my personal estate. I will unto my son John Jamison one hundred and fifty acres of the tract of land on which I now live subject to the bequest before mentioned in favour of my wife nancy which said one hundred and fifty acres shall include all buildings & improvements now made on the afor said tract of land. The remaining part of my real estate I allow to be sold and the price thereof equally divided between my daughters viz Mary, Hannah, Jenny and Martha Jamison share and share alike the remaining part of my personal estate I allow to be equally divided between my five children viz John, mary, Hannah, Jenny and Martha Jamison And I do hereby nominate and appoint my wife nancy & my son John Jamison Executors of this my testament & last will.

Notes:

Mr. Jamison was an Innkeeper and resided in Centerville, Buckingham where he purchased 167 acres[14] of land at the junction of Durham and York roads. This land was purchased from John Gregg(of New Jersey and bought by him 9/14/1767), Mrs. Jamison's father, and later sold by her administrator on September 3, 1790. A road was opened in 1759 from Jamison's mill, located on the southwest branch of Neshaminy Creek to the York road from which travelers headed from or to Philadelphia from or to Delaware. Mr. Jamison was listed in 1764 on the tax list for Buckingham. From the History of Bucks Co., Pa. The Safety Committee for the county held their meetings here, between 1772 and 1778, shortly after Mr. Jamison's death. Mrs. Jamison was listed on the assessor's list as innkeeper in 1772 just before her marriage to John Bogart.

Mrs. Jamison married second, November 14, 1772, First Presbyterian Church, Philadelphia, PA., John **Bogart**[2,3]. Mr. Bogart, after his marriage to Mary Jamison, ran the tavern & inn in Buckingham until 1778 when he died. Mrs. Bogart removed with her family to Philadelphia until her death in 1785. Her will was dated March 7, 1785, Philadelphia, PA. and proved March 15th, eight days later. In the will she bequeathed everything to her five children: Mary Bogart, Sarah Bogart, Frances Bogart, John Jamison, and William Caldwell Jamison. Martha Jamison, Mrs. Bogart left out completely and the reasons for that are provided under her history.

The foregoing genealogy is different than that described under Rev. Jameson's book, The Jamesons In America. In the 1901 publication William Caldwell Jamison was listed as a son of John and Miss Caldwell Jamison of Little Britain, Lancaster co., PA. This man was born May 11, 1776 and listed in the above reference as having married Jane **Downs** in 1894 *(<u>6</u>), which is incorrect based on the will and administration of Mary Gregg Jamison Bogart. A further elucidation on the subject is given in the will of William C. Jamison, dated October 22, 1818, Montgomery co., TN., "Anything due me on account of my part of the estate, real or personal, of my mother's estate, Mrs. Mary Bogart, deceased, of the City of Philadelphia...". Mrs. Jamison was the administrator of Henry Jamison's estate on August 14, 1767, and she retained the inn at Buckingham. When John Bogart died in 1778, Mrs. Bogart maintained the land and premises which were later sold in 1790 by her administrator[14]. John **Greer** was appointed guardian of Sarah Bogart, her daughter, born 1776, Bucks co., PA. Mary Bogart married James **Grier** and Frances Bogart married John **Shaw**. Mrs. Bogart named James Greer and William **Oliphant** as executors.

Notes:

John Jamison was a Captain in the Revolutionary War[6,1]. He writes, "Capt. John Jamison in Col. Baxter's Penn. Regiment, commissioned Sept. 7, 1776; taken prisoner at Fort Washington, Nov. 16, 1776, and released on parole Aug., 1778; exchanged March 26, 1781."[6] However, other records claim differently. According to

the DAR records the following is listed: "John Jameson, b. 1736; d. 3/27/1796; m. Martha Grier, PS-PA". This listing indicates that Mr. Jamison was in a capacity in which he *supplied* the colonial militia with various products rather than actually engaged in military conduct. There were many such farmers as John Jamison who provided much needed materials, clothes, and foodstuffs for the militia and several records throughout this publication provide ample illustration of this.

There is, however, another listing for a John Jamison of Bucks county, PA. who married Nancy **McDuffy.** This listing reads: "John Jameson, b. 12/3/1755; d. 3/23/1836; m. Nancy McDuffy, Capt.-PA". Captain Jamison was a son of Daniel and Mary (**Baxter**) Jamison Sr. of Nockamixon, Bucks co., PA. Col. Hugh Baxter's company, which Capt. John Jamison was listed under, was his grandfather whose daughter, Mary Baxter, was John Jamison's mother. The troubles which plagued Capt. Jamison are captured in his profile under index #26013.

Mr. John Jamison, our subject, was listed under the 1759 tax records for Bucks co., PA. with 3 horses, 5 cattle, 27 sheep, 250 acres of land, receiving rents of \$20.00, and 1 negroe at a rate of 5 pounds 8 shillings[4]. He was again listed in Warwick, 1778[4] as follows: 2 horses, 2 cattle, 3 sheep, 70 acres of land at \$5.00 rent, for 2 pounds 3 shillings[1]. Tax lists, Warwick, 1778, 5 pounds. Mr. Jamison owned considerable land and inherited the old homestead. Mrs. Jamison was a brother of Rev. James **Grier** of Deep Run, PA., a revolutionary veteran and an Elder in the Presbyterian Church at Neshaminy.

Mr. Jamison was listed in the Bucks co. tax lists with 3 horses, 3 cattle, 8 sheep at a rate of 3 pounds, 8 shillings[3]and in 1778 list for Warwick, at 2 ponds, 15 shillings. Mr. Jamison was a soldier and an Ensign in the Revolutionary War. A devout presbyterian Mr. Jamison was an Elder in the Neshaminy Church in 1794. His will, dated 5/15/1807, mentions wife, Hannah, sons, Robert, James, John, and William, daughters Jane and Margaret. proved 1811, Bucks co., PA.

Notes:

Mr. Jamison inherited his father's farm with the conditions of paying off the mortgage and paying his younger brother, Alexander, 100 pounds. Yet the conditions and the poor harvests probably weighed against the young man and the Jamisons lost the farm in 1765. Mr. Jamison, no doubt, resided with relatives, possibly the Van de Vastines, his in-laws. Mr. Jamison later was employed as overseer of roads in Warwick. It was shortly after this that Mr. Jamison migrated from Pennsylvania to Virginia appearing as early as 1768 in Loudon co., VA. He was on the tax lists for Shelburne Parish, Loudon co., Va. from 1768 to as late as 1778, along with the following men:

He appears to have moved again, about seven years later in 1785 to Shenandoah co., VA. which sat next to Hardy co., WV in the Cedar Creek area where the **Frye** family settled. At the end he dies in Hardy co., WV. The Shelburne Parish list provides yet another thought. The Jamisons-John, William, and Alexander-were no doubt the brothers of Robert Jamison. Another interesting point is the list of last dates on these men: Robert Jamison 1778; Benjamin Jamison, 1779; Alexander and George Jamison, 1777; John Jamison in 1779, and finally William Jamison in 1789. Benjamin Jameson is the Jameson Indexed as #35000, who migrated south to Greene co., TN. Benjamin names one son, Robert.

Located in the extreme north of Shenandoah co., VA., in 1785, this spot roughly sits just south of Cedar Creek and Cacapone River and Wheatfield, an area where Shenandoah and Frederick co., VA., and Hardy co., WV. meet. Robert Jamison was listed with nine people in the 1785 tax list. Along with Jamison were John Colville, Benjamin Frye, John Frye, and John Frye's son, Jacob Frye. In 1800 when Jamison died, John Colville and James Wilson were both buyers at the estate auction.

I will and bequeath to my daughter <u>Nancy</u> wife of Benjamin Long one promisory note cauling for five hundred dollars when given and all the intrust not paid at the time of my decease. I will and bequeath unto my daughter <u>Isabel</u> wife of Jesse Bussey one promisory note I hold against him cauling for five hundred dollars when given and all interest not paid at my decease. I will and bequeath unto my daughter <u>Mary</u> wife of David Roberts one promisory note I hold against him cauling for five hundred dollars when given and all interest not paid at the time of my decease. I will and bequeath unto my daughter <u>Ann</u> wife of George W. Paugh five dollars in addition to what she has already got. I will and bequeath unto my son <u>David</u> five dollars in addition to what he has already got. I will and bequeath unto the oldest sons of <u>Spicer</u> Jamison deceased Alfred and John Jemison two promisory notes I hold against said deceased and money to make the sum of three hundred dollars with said notes to be paid to them soon after my decease shear and shear alike. I will to James Corbley Jamison son of said deceased fifty dollars to be paid to him when he becums twenty one years old. I will and bequeath to my son <u>Amos</u> Jemison five dollars in addition to what he has already got.

I will and bequeath unto Amos Jemison two oldest sons David and Garret Jemison two hundred dollars to be paid to them soon after my decease shear ans shear alike. I will and bequeath to Pierce Lindsey Jemison son of Amos Jemison

fifty dollars to be paid to him when he becums twetny one years old. I will and bequeath unto Isabel Jemison daughter of Amos Jemison my bed and bedding to be delivered to her soon after my decease. I will and bequeath unto Nancy Jemison wife of Amos Jemison all that remains of my household furniture of whatsoever kind it may be of that I have at the time of my decease to be delivered to her soon after my decease. I will and bequeath the remainder of my estate to my four sons <u>William John Alfred</u> and <u>James</u> Jemison shere and shere alike to be equally divided between them.

And my will is that Alfred or James departing this life before their marriage and having neither wife nor heirs his shere or sheres to be paid to the three sons of Spicer Jemison deceased and three sons of Amos Jemison to be equally divided between them shere and shere alike.

I do hereby nominate consitute and apoint my friend Benjamin Wrick and my son John Jemison executors of this my last Will and Testament hear by revoking all other wills heare to fore made by me. I Witness whereof I have here unto set my hand and seal this Second day of June in the year of our Lord one Thousand eight hundred and fifty nine.

Notes:

In 1774, Rev. Nathaniel Irwin was called to the pulpit and became the new pastor at Neshaminy church when Charles **Beatty** died two years before. His family came out of Chester co., PA. where he was born and was Scotch-Irish. Having graduated Princeton, Mr. Irwin along with James **Madison** had helped found the American Whig Party in an upper room of Nassau Hall. He preached along the thinly-inhabited central Pennsylvania and Virginia areas before coming to Bucks county. Nathaniel Irwin had a "commanding appearance, a powerful voice, and a long, intelligent face." In Neshaminy which he took with enthusiam and vigor Mr. Irwin was also a prescriber of medicine, handled wills, settled estates, advised widows, and assisted in property transfer. Residing on a large farm on Easton Road he sold produce as well.

His interests in mechanics fashioned an idea that became the boom to boating. One of his listeners at the time was John **Fitch**, who walking home from church in April of 1785, got the idea that steam might be used as a propelling force. Making some rough drafts he brought them to Irwin, who intrigued, showed Fitch several books he had on the topic. With insight and ability John Fitch then invented the first model steamboat and when he wrote his autobiography dedicated it to Nathaniel Irwin.

Colonial patriots the Irwins thundered out against the British and made many enemies of the loyalists. In August of 1777 Washington crossed the Delaware and with 11,000 troops marching behind him pitched his tent not a half mile from the Neshaminy church. Tradition states that the "Stars and Stripes" was displayed for the first time at this camp overlooking the Neshaminy Creek. Irwin and Washington appeared to have establish some rapport as the church was used as a hospital and some of the soldiers who fell ill and died were buried in the cemetery there. Washington remained encamped here for 13 days before marching off to the Bradnywine.

The following spring the British were in Philadelphia. Washington had left General **Lacey** and 400 raw recruits sitting two miles away from the church when they were surprised at dawn of May 1, 1778. The Battle of Crooked Billet as it was called rallied the congregation to a fever pitch as they aided the revolutionary cause in one way or another. After the war and despite wartime interruptions and financial crises, the Presbyterian congregation grew, "largely to Irwin's popularity.".

A popular minister, Rev. Irwin was plagued by domestic problems. His only son was an alcoholic and his wife's infidelity was the talk of the neighborhood. Apparently Martha's trampings had become so legendary that in August, 1781 Erkuries **Beatty** wrote his brother near York town, a letter which comments, "The Parson has outgeneral'd his wife at last, and caught her...." Mrs. Irwin died in 1806 and the Pastor married 1807, Priscilla **McKinstry**, died August 3, 1822, Ohio, a "most discreet and sensible helpmeet". Ever was

there a more compelling reason why Mary **Gregg** Jamison Bogart, Martha's mother, left her daughter out of the will?

Ever interested in everything that he perused Rev. Irwin was instrumental in moving the county seat from Newtown to Doylestown. He played an important part in establishing the county's almshouse and performing the first marriage of an elderly black couple there. Music, the backbone of contention in the early 1780s, gave way to livelier tunes which better suited the mood of the congregation and the general populace at large. Rev. Irwin promoted this theme and in 1788 he organized a concert which was especially newsworthy and reported in the Pennsylvania Gazette. He also introduced Watt's hymns in place of Rouse's versions of the Psalms of David and so upset one man that he stormed out to the tavern at Warrington and ordered a "gill o'rum to quench his disgust.".

Mr. Jamison was a contemporary and cousin(once removed) of Van De Vastine Jamison (#26690) and no doubt accompanied his cousin to Orangeburgh, South Carolina. Along with them may have been Van de Vastine's uncle, Henry Jamison, who might also have settled in South Carolina(see Van De Vastine Jamison (26690). They probably arrived some time about 1785, Mr. Jamison staying with Van de Vastine for a short period before moving on. In a land deed dated June 4, 1786, Savannah, Chatham co., Oliver Bowen of Savannah sold a tract of land in Effingham co., GA. to James Belcher of Savannah. Witness: William C. Jamison of Savannah. Mr. Jamison engaged in the real estate business out of Savannah for a number of years for his firm was involved with several transactions in the area and northward as well. On April 13, 1794, James R. Whitney, tax collector for Franklin co., GA., sold to Thomas Harwood of Lower Marlboro, Maryland, 1000 acres in Franklin county situated on the middle fork of the Oconee River, southwest side adjoining land of Porter, Gibson, and Jamason, a tract surveyed for William C. Jamison and Company on July 9, 1790. There is finally a deed which dated August 9, 1794 puts Jamison in Wilkes county, GA. when Benjamin May of Wilkes co., Ga., sells to William Wallace of Edgefield co., SC 150 acres in Edgefield county, SC *(13) on the Savannah River, a tract granted Richard Kennedy December 1, 1772. The witness to the subscribing deed was William C. Jamison of Wilkes county, GA. By 1794 Jamison was in Wilkes county having married Jane Downs a month and a half earlier.

The Downs Family was led by <u>William Downs</u> of Scotland, who emigrated some time in the early 1700s. He settled in Orange co., VA. Mr. <u>Henry Downs</u>, his son, d. 1778, SC., married Jane **Douglass**, and resided in Virginia before moving to Laurens co., SC. The children of this marriage were: Henry, William, Richard, Joseph, Jonathan, George, Ambrose, Elizabeth, and Eleanor. Henry's son, <u>William Downs</u>, was born in 1730, Orange co., VA. and died January 12, 1802, Clarksville, TN. He married Phoebe **Hogue**, who died between 1773-75, South Carolina. The children were: Henry, Jonathan, Joseph, Hiram, William, George, Elizabeth, Polly, Sarah, Zilpah, and Jane, who married William C. Jamison. Mr. William Downs removed in 1758 to Laurens co., SC. He joined in 1775 the Colonial Army as Adjutant Colonel of the 2nd Regiment, but in 1778 gave his commissioned to his brother, Joseph Downs, and left to settle in Wilkes co., GA. Here Mr. Downs was in the Battle of Kettle Creek and became a very wealthy landowner and prominent citizen in Georgia. An influencial business man Mr. Downs ventured as one of the major stockholders in the Tennessee Land Company along with John **Sevier**, who was Governor of Tennessee from its inception in 1796. In a land trip he made with Sevier in 1802, Mr. Downs died while scouting the bend of the Tennessee River.

Mr. Jamison appears to have left Georgia at the end of the 1790s, for in 1798 he is listed on a tax list for Montgomery co., TN and in a January 1, 1799 land deed he is recorded as purchasing from Morgan **Brown** a lot in Palmyra, Montgomery co., TN. He does not show up in the 1790 Reconstructed Census for GA or in 1800, and the earliest census records for Tennessee show that he was listed in the 1820 census, the year before his death. In 1800 William Jamison became the first County Court Clerk for Montgomery county, TN. He was appointed for several more terms after that. In an 1806 deed from John **Shelby** a bill of sale recorded the selling of one negroe to William C. Jamison and witnessed by Thomas **Shelby**. In that same year he was granted a petition from which he was allowed to keep a flatbottom boat in Clarksville for the purpose of ferrying his family and stock across the Cumberland. He had land on both sides of the river.

Mr. Jamison's will was dated October 2, 1818 and probated August of 1821. He mentions children Mary, Henry, William, John, David, Isaac, Sarah, Charlotte, Elizabeth, James, and Albert. Executors were: David **Shelby**, Dr. John Shelby, and G. W. L. **Marr**. Mrs. Eleanor Jamison's will was dated October 24, 1834 and probated May 7, 1835. She mentions children, James, Albert, William, and David Jamison.

Notes:

Dr. Jamison, a practicing physician in Orangeburgh, South Carolina, probably arrived in South Carolina some time about 1785 in company with his cousin, William Caldwell Jamison (#26652). A land deed in Georgia place W. C. Jamison there in 1786, while the 1790 SC census places Van de Vastine there at that time. With them was probably Henry Jamison, Jamison's uncle, whose records pop up in and around Orangeburgh, SC and in Georgia. What schooling and education Mr. Jamison received is unknown, though it must have been considerable and Jamison must have been accomplished in of himself to have been as successful as he was. He was entirely caught up with his community, largely interested in agriculture, and politically and commercially motivated. He represented Orangeburgh District in the state legislature from 1806-08 and 1818-1820 and operated a lime kiln near the village where he resided.

Colonel Jacob **Rumph** was born July 9, 1752, Orangeburgh, SC. the son of Jacob Rumph, who emigrated circa 1735 with the Rev. John Ulrick **Giessendanner** and company. The families that came with the Minister were all from or from nearby the village of Canton, Switzerland. Col. Jacob Rumph while in the colonies acquired hundreds of thousands of acres of land throughout the Carolinas and Georgia. One land deed alone recorded 281,097 acres and he had over 50 grants of land. Colonel Rumph was promoted to General of the South Carolina militia and was involved during the American Revolution. A brother, David Rumph, was selected January 15, 1775, by the first Provincal Congress of SC for carrying into execution the Continental Association for St. George's Parish in Dorchester. The Rumphs have distinguished themselves throughout American history in military service and in agriculture. General Rumph died December 12, 1812, SC. Mrs. Anne Rumph died September 30, 1835. Mr. Jamison, in company with his father-in-law, Pierce Lynch and their family removed to Grant district, Monongalia county, WV. in 1835. Both men were farmers and prominent stock raisers in the county. Mrs. Jamison was a daughter of Pierce Lynch of Dunkard, Greene co., PA. Her sister married Amos Jamison, a brother to her John Jamison II. Mr. Lynch was a son of John Lynch, who settled upon Little Indian Creek in Monongalia co., WV. and died in 1819 there. Edward Bussey was the son of Jesse and Margaret (**Smith**) Bussey, born in 1793-94[3] in Harford co., MD and died in Greene co., PA[4]. Little can be added to what has already been applied to Mr. Jamison. Research shows he was in the War of 1812. He was born in Savannah, Georgia in 1795 and was four years old when his parents took him along with his brother and sister to Montgomery co., Tennessee in 1799. He grew up on his father's farm across the river from Clarksville, TN. He was a talented kid with a flair for business and religion. He was well-liked and honored for his many devotions and attentions to civic and church affairs. A man of the earth by birth and upbringing Mr. Jamison prospered as a farmer on a well tended and growing farm while excelling in the business of building roads in Tennessee.

He removed in 1816 to Murfreesborough, Rutherford co., TN after his stint in the military service. In Murfreesboro he established a large farm and flurished in his road contracts and was married there in 1819 to Elizabeth Beatty. Miss Beatty was a daughter of Captain William (b. 5/1/1760; d. 6/11/1835) and Ann (Bass) (b. 8/23/1773; d. 3/1854) Beatty of Murfreesboro, Rutherford co., TN. Commissioned by Patrick **Henry** of the 2nd Brunswick county Company he was engaged during the Revolutionary War. When it was over he removed to Tennessee in 1808 and settled on a 600 acre tract granted him for military services. Mrs. Jamison died in 1835, Murfreesboro, TN. and Henry Jamison married secondly to Sarah W. Thomas, a daughter of William (b. 7/10/1772; d. 4/7/1841) and Eliza (Bass)(b. 2/10/1790) Thomas. Eliza and Annie Bass were daughters of John **Bass** of Brunswick county, Virginia.

Jamison left Murfreesboro right after his wife's death, settling about 8 miles southwest of that town. Under the North Carolina land Grants, Henry D. Jamison was listed as acquiring 22 acres in Rutherford co., TN on November 16, 1836. He remained upon this farm until the time of his death. Mrs. Jamison remarried after Henry's death. Planter, author, physician, and soldier Mr. Jamison left Platt Springs Academy in Lexington and at the age of 14 entered the sophomore class at South Carolina College. In his senior year he left the College and studied law for three years being admitted to the bar in 1830. He practiced his profession for two years when he married his first cousin, Elizabeth Rumph, and thereafter gave up the law and became a planter for the duration of his life. Yet, within this life span, he was introduced to the troubling influences of politics and to the broad belief in God and Church.

On May 2, 1835 he was listed as one of the original members of the Orangeburgh Presbyterian Church which was organized on that date. Along with him received by certificate were: Caroline **Glover**, Elizabeth Jamison, Elizabeth **Rumph**, Van de Vastine Jamison, M.D., Mary Jamison, Sanders **Glover**, Mary **Dwight**, and, interestingly, a number of slaves then belonging to many of the parishoners. In the following year, 1836, he was elected to the State House of Representatives, and so popular and of like opinion was he to his constituents that he served for the next twelve years. For much of this time he was chairman of the committee on military affairs and as such introduced a bill which established military schools in the state. During all of this time Mr. Jamison rose through the ranks of the South Carolina Cavalry becoming a Brigade General. In 1842 the Governor of South Carolina appointed Jamison a member of the board of visitors to these academies. Caught up in the political arena of the 1832 tariff, Jamison in 1844 voted with the minority against the resolutions declaring the 1842 tariff unconstitutional ⁽¹⁸⁾. In so doing he cut his own political throat which probably led to his retirement from politics in 1848.

During these last few years David Jamison pursued his chief interest-historical studies. His writings were written in the Southern Quarterly Review from 1843 to 1850 in which he scholarly researched modern European history. Much of his philosophy was bent on these findings along with the Wilmot Proviso *(19) that matured his political observations and experiences. He argued that "slavery was the indispensable basis for a successful republic, and that the abolition campaign and the excesses of the Northern democracy made separation as necessary as it was desirable.". An active campaigner he attended the Nashville Convention of 1850, and in the following years an active participant for the cause of South Carolina. Removing to Barnwell District he purchased a plantation there in 1859 and represented the citizens in the secession convention becoming the President of the Secession Convention December 17, 1860. A member of its executive board David Jamison advised and legalize the formalities of their history-making activities. A personal friend of Jefferson **Davis** he guided the course of history from personal commitment. With the convention over and

war on the horizon, Jamison authored the publication, "Life and Times of Bertrand Du Guesclin", a two volume work on the Hundred Years' War, in 1864 published just before he died.

General Jenkins was with James Longstreet through most of the Civil War campaigns. He served with distinction and died at the Battle of the Wilderness in 1864. In an ironic twist of fate, Longstreet had rode down the planck road, setting his men when he met General Jenkins, an old comrade who he had not seen in

months. With his troops in place along the Brock Road at Wilderness, VA., he and Jenkins rode down the dirt trail when Mahone's brigade, set up near the Brock fired upon the men mistaking them for Federal officers. Longstreet was shot through the throat, but lived, while General Jenkins was immediately killed with a shot to the chest.

Major Micah Jenkins, a grandson of David F. Jamison served in the Rough Rider Regiment in the Spanish-American War with Col. Theodore **Roosevelt**. While Roosevelt was President he honored Jenkins with a ceremonial sword for his conspicuous bravery at the Battle of San Juan Hill in Cuba. Later he was appointed a Federal Collector under the IRS for South Carolina. John M. Jenkins graduated from West Point and served through the Spanish-American War. <u>19.</u> The Wilmot Proviso, introduced by David Wilmot in 1846, a PA. Democrat, clearly defined the issues of freedom and slavery by defining the new territory beyond Texas completely free of involuntary servitude and slavery. It also gave rise to the Free Soil Party movement that led directly to the founding of the present day Republican Party. While the South agreed in part to Wilmot's support of annexing the Lone Star State, the South, unfortunately, missed grasping the true significance of the Proviso. With dawning horror, the South realized that the net effect of Squatter Sovereignty resulted with a Congress once again successfully leaving the issue of slavery unresolved until a territory was ready for statehood.
