NOTES

It must be noted here that prior research of the origins of these Jamisons are convoluted and distorted. There has been no correct genealogy of facts concerning Alexander Jamison, his son, James, and James' two sons, John and Robert Jamison. No references pervade the period in question that tells us that Alexander was the father of James, and likewise, James, the father of John and Robert. Most group sheets show that Alexander and James were from Glasgow, Lanark county, Scotland. Yet none has proven it with any references, whatsoever. Previous publications and many of the redundant trees for this branch distort our views and biased our thoughts to a point that has made researching the branch more difficult. Everyone wants at the truth. One author comments in his book, *(1) that "William and Mary College states that the book "The Jamesons In America", Rev. E. O. Jameson, 1901, Rumford Press is as accurate as humanly possible." This seemingly innocuous statement tells us that Mr. S. K. Helms never verified the facts in Rev. Jameson's book, thus compounding the confusion with inaccuracies and errors that exist in Rev. Jameson's book with those of his own. He also mentions that the order of Thomas and Jane Dickey Jamison's children's births are not "that important" *(2) giving rise to even more doubt about his attempt to seriously study and consider the more difficult aspects that make this Jamison genealogy of such concern. As did Alvina Williams, S. K. Helms doesn't call into question Rev. Jameson's comments and statements regarding these Jamisons, nor the errors, nor the fact that no references highlight and earmark the important pieces that make genealogy uncompromising in its search for truth. Why did Helms and Williams, themselves, in their respective publications, not provide the sources to their histories if they were so committed and dedicated to the understanding of the study of genealogy? Was it laziness on their part not to get at the veracities of the case history or was it simply failing to follow up as so many do in researching their ancestry?

One of the more pressing problems to be wrestle with concerns this very early history of the Jamisons. If they are from Glasgow, then chances are they were a part of the prominent Jamisons related to the clan Stewart. Alexander Jamison's *(3) son, James emigrated around 1700 to Philadelphia, and settled, traditionally, in York county, PA. Prior to arriving in the colonies, James, "it is said" *(4) migrated first to Galway co., Ireland. A single source indicates that indeed a James Jamison had resided there who had a son, John, the historical dates a close proximity for some possible speculation. No shred of hard evidence, however, confirms any of the earlier history*(5) to be true except for what records exist here in America. As far as can be verified the earliest member of this family was John Jamison who took out his first known land patent June 1, 1741 on Moorman's River in the vicinity of Mountain Plains Presbyterian Church. To get at the roots of Jamison and the settlers of this area around the mid 1730s one wonders perhaps if Jamison followed the Scotch leaders Michael **Woods** and William **Wallace** across the Blue Ridge in 1734 and settled into what was then

(The disparity of the ages)

Traditional records have shown that James Jamison (143) had a son, John(145). Presumably, then, John was a son of James, though I have always held some suspicion regarding the disparity in age between John(145) and his children-Alexander(146), Thomas(147), John(148), Samuel(149), and Jane(150) in Rev. Jameson's book. John Jamison(145) born 1680 was 52 when Thomas(147) was born. Not all that unusual, perhaps, though I often wondered why a man 52 years old wanted more children. If we take the concept of agricultural need, then surely John(145) would not only have had his children at a far earlier time when his own advancing age would require them, but presumably he would have had more than the five he supposedly did have. Speculations of this sort provide formidable challenges and represent a need for careful study. I have yet to consider all the angles imbued in this particular case, yet some striking records and general information has materialize creating more questions than answers.

In the process of those research sweeps I make, small bits of information collected over the years. Then, in 1986, Steven **Harter** wrote to me concerning his genealogy. He became a subscriber to the Jameson newsletter and in the intervening years I researched his history and discovered his ancestors. At the last he sent me some material his grandmother had discovered in the course of her own investigation of the family tree. The data having no relevant value to her own family tree remained locked away for many years. When she died Mr. Harter forwarded this material to me. There appears no denying the relationship or semblance of the James-to-John relationship from the data she garnered. Regrettably, this data did not come with a single reference and I was between and betwixt as to what to do. I do not doubt the data because it did not tie-in with her own ancestry and she had no reason to fabricate the material. The only relavant thing lacking is the sources for the information.

(It all seems so familiar)

In her hand she wrote the following information down verbatim from whatever sources she had at hand.

"JOHN(her capitals) married a Dutch girl. She was RACHEL **OPDYKE**, her family had come to Pennsylvania in the late 1600s. JOHN and RACHAEL lived and died in York co., PA. They were married in 1702 and had these children.

1. JAMES JAMESON BORN 1704

2. ALEXANDER JAMESON BORN 1706

3. THOMAS JAMESON BORN 1708

4. JOHN JAMESON BORN 1711

5. DAVID JAMESON BORN 1714

6. JANE JAMESON BORN 1716. ROBERT JAMESON born in 1682, married SARAH OPDYKE."

"Rachael was born in New York", wrote Steven Harter in a subsequent latter he sent. Additional materials presented by his grandmother produced the following data: "JAMES JAMISON removed 1730 to New Jersey; ALEXANDER JAMISON married first PHOEBE LEWIS, and 2) 1740, RHODA JAMERSON- he removed 1735 to Augusta co., VA; THOMAS JAMISON married 1734, SAMANTHA BELL WILLIS, and he was in Culpeper co., VA. in 1732; DAVID JAMISON married 1740, ELIZABETH CRAWFORD". They remained in York co., PA. and may have had a son, David, who was born circa 1741, and married Magdalina Hershey; "Jane Jamison no other information". The Opdykes have been in America since the early 1600s I discovered from a genealogy on the mentioned family, and settled throughout the New Jersey, New York, and Pennsylvania areas. Supplementing this she notes a JOHN JAMISON who married first MARGARET WHITE and in 1738, MARY BELL WILKINSON and settled in 1741 on Moorman's River in Albemarle co., VA. This....

....piece of information provided the link to John Jamison whose children were Samuel, Thomas, Jane, John, and Alexander. The Thomas Jamison listed among them is the one who married first Jane **Dickey** and later Hannah **Taggart**. John Jamison sold in 1748 a part of the 1741 patent to John **McColloch**, a brother to Thomas McColloch, whose daughter, Rachel, married Samuel Jamison's son, Thomas Jamison. Samuel Jamison was a son of John Jamison. The Wilkinsons removed to southern Virginia at about the same time Thomas Jamison(147)(son of John Jameson) settled in the Franklin/Henry county area.

(Getting the picture)

The relationships and kin in and around Albemarle county are many. Questions stemming from information on other Jamesons have, from time to time, cause some confusion between the branches. Orange to Goochland to Augusta counties today were derived from the region as owned by William Gooch who sold the land in tracts back in the 1730s and '40s. The old records provide a more comprehensive view of the Jamisons during the earliest periods of their arrival, though continues to leave a number of trying and unanswered questions. Yet enough remains to clearly etch out the singular life of John Jamison(#30420) in Albemarle county, Virginia. The documents in the county also explain and detail more of the relationships among the other non-Jameson families in the area as well, providing a clearer understanding of the Jamison tree. This tree, then, is different and far more straight forward in its interpretation from Rev. Jameson's book and the author's mentioned earlier. Yet the Revised Family Tree(RFT) comes closest to addressing the needs of the situation-the need to overcome the 52 year age gap between John Jamison(145) and Thomas Jamison(147) as shown in Rev. Jameson's book.; and the need to explain why Samuel Jamison(149), who married Jane, might not have been born in 1710, but rather in 1728. The RFT now clearly makes distinctive two John Jamisons and not one-the first John(145) who married Rachael Opdyke and the logical insertion of the correct John, who married Margaret White, and had Thomas Jamison(147) who married Dickey and Taggart. Unfortunately, no real proof clearly demonstrates the RFT.

Information from a survey conducted prior to the Civil War provides viable proof that the Opdikes resided in the area that the Jamisons did. South from the town of Free Union and halfway along a road to Owensville near the confluence of Moorman's and Mechem's Rivers was the home of a Mr. Opdike which lay on a branch of Mechum's River to the east. From this junction the Jamisons left the area and settled further west near the Gap and south at Ivy Creek. This further strengthens the case in the **RFT**.

In a follow up situation the question of Samuel Jamison(149) Rev. Jamison contends that "He went south." Could he have meant south of Pennsylvania? Research on Samuel Jamison has shown conclusively that he resided in Albemarle co., VA and that he died there in Fredericksville Parish in 1788. He was married and had a number of children which is found in the below genealogy. One recent researcher states that Samuel's children were:

Alexander, b. 1/16/1732 Thomas, b.11/7/1737 Mary, b.12/26/1742 John, b. 2/21/1747 Samuel, b. 7/13/1753.

The information came from Samuel Jamison's Revolutionary War pension file #5112 in which a copy of a Bible page insertion was added. The inherent problems here are the age gaps among the children and their marriages later. That is, if Thomas Jamison was born in 1737, he was 51 when he married Rachel McColloch. Could Samuel Jamison Sr., have been born about 1710, then? Was there another Thomas Jamison who married Rachel McCollough?

One other situation crops up within this early genealogy, and while it is discovered also in Alvina William's book, it is originally found first in Rev. Jameson's 1901 publication. Alexander Jamison(146) was a son of

John and (Margaret?) Jamison. He married and settled in Albemarle co., VA. like many of his siblings. No marriage or spouse has been found for him all these years, yet there appears no evidence to the contrary that he had at least three children: Thomas(151) and William(152), and George(153). Two situations unfold from this. First, was Alexander Jamison the father of George, William, and Thomas Jamison? The evidence suggests he was not. The facts point directly at Samuel and Margaret Craig Jamison. The other difficulty presents itself when Rev. Jameson's information shows William Jamison(151) with children George Balis, Susan, and Lucy. This William Jamison is in fact the William Jamison(38526) who was a son of David and Pattey Jamison of Prince William County, VA. After his, William's, wife's death, he removed with his family to Owensville, Bath county, Ky. where he died in 1834. Research has shown conclusively that this is so and can be view under his William Jamison's index number 38526. Does this negate Thomas and George, too? One can only guess, or rather, prove it.

I am also in receipt of material in which it is suggested that John Jameson was from Northumberland co., VA. The author of this information does not show any conclusive evidence that the John Jameson discovered in Northumberland county was the one on Moorman's River in Albemarle county. Additionally, he states that he was born about 1685 and died in 1776, Augusta co., VA. His wife was Jane, and their grandsons were Sarah McNabb and John Perry. Their daughter was Jane, born January 29, 1713, Northumberland co., VA. who married Thomas Craig. In hanging the bits of evidence he includes material which takes in several other separate Jameson genealogies as well. The inaccuracies here are tantamount to causing the same confusions that have existed in previous publications and will no doubt send other researchers off on a wild goose chase if not taken into account. If the foregoing is true how does one note the seeming inaccuracies of John's birth in 1685 and Jane's in the 1720s. For I can not doubt that Jane and John for which he speaks in his correspondence is that of the John and Jane (Erwin) Jamison as listed as Index #40900 further recalled in this book. Juxtapose the one branch with the information on another Jameson that comes straight out of Index #41300 and out of the Albemarle branch and pandomonia results. For sons, he's listed: William Jameson(#41300), who married Sarah _____, and settled in Rockbridge co.; Samuel Jamison (#30489), who married Jane (McCollough?) of Albemarle county; Robert Jamison (#40918) of Tinkling Springs, Augusta co.; and James Jameson (#37132) who married Mary Gaines. Was there really a John and Jane Jameson of Northumberland co., VA? Maybe. Jane Jamison, the researcher duly notes, was born in the Northumberland county and the records show this to be true. But who is this Jane Jamison? However, I disagree that any of the balance of his work is anything but false and misleading.

(In conclusion)

Additional inaccuracies and mistaken assumptions can be found throughout Rev. Jameson's book as with the researches from the situations discussed above. I can only assume that Rev. Jameson received much of his material from others and never verified it, hence the lack of sources cited throughout the book with the one exception: his own family's history in New Hampshire. This problem has plagued newer researchers with a vengence and has created untold difficulties in explaining to others why this man doesn't belong here and why this branch belongs there. As stated in the Genealogical Guide, all genealogies must be suspect until proven otherwise. In the following genealogy as much history and sources have been combined to help understand the difficulties here, rather than to either ignore the problematic issues or to explain away the falacies that exist in prior publications. Intent is not to necessarily place blame yet to encourage active thought and discussion, for even among these pages may lay errors of serious unintent simply missed during the research. I have adhered to the traditional approach and make it abundantly clear in this preamble that the genealogy starts with John Jamison #30420 and with no other. While the traditional speaks for itself and has been sourced for your own investigation please keep in mind that the truth has yet to be discovered. No one has yet to offer up any actual documented proof of Alexander to James to John Jamison. Additionally, I have included under the aforesaid John Jamison's notes the revision spoken of in the above discussion for prosperity's sake. Until references can clarify the issues at stake in Harter's material it can only be supposition at best.

Tradition states that he was born in Glasgow, Scotland, Mr. Jamison emigrated first to County Galway, Ireland prior to 1680. There is a record of a James Jamison in Galway, Ireland, but it provides no other information other than his residence, and whether it is he of which we speak is not known. His emigration to America is unknown. Some of the earliest emigration listings are as follows:

While tradition cites that James Jamison emigrated some time around 1700 to America and settled in York co., PA., where he died, no proof has been extracted from the PA records to show this. One of the first records to prove these Jamisons were in America comes from Virginia on John Jamison, a grandson of James, whose records put him in Albemarle co., Virginia in 1741. This county is due south of York co., PA. but does not tell

us for certain that James Jamison was ever in Pennsylvania, much less York county. There is, however, David Jamison(30434) whose death occurred in York co., PA. the estate and will administered by his wife, Elizabeth Jamison. He was the grandson of James(30410) and the son of John(30420). While no record has been forthcoming it appears he may have had a son, David *(11) Jamison who was born some time in the 1740s and married Magdalina **Hershey**. This needs to be looked into.

Robert Jamison (#30421) was born 1682, Galway, Ireland. He may have been the one who married Sarah Opdyke in Pennsylvania, since her family had been here prior to the Jamisons. James Jamison and his family settled along the Susquehanna River, some say in the vicinity of York county, PA. Again, there is no proof of this. There is a possibility that Robert may have been the father of Robert Jamison (#29300) who married Sarah **McKee** about 1745. Robert and Sarah Mckee Jamison had the following children: William, Robert, Arthur, Thomas, Jane, John, David, and Samuel. William Jamison, research shows, was in Northumberland county, PA., not more than 35 miles north of York county. Interestingly enough, these Jamisons removed to northern Virginia and settled in Augusta county not far from Albemarle county.

Mr. Jamison removed to Virginia prior to 1740, residing in Albemarle county. In a deed by Thomas Moorman in 1740, he states his land was bounded by John Jamison along Moorman's River [16]. In 1741, Jamison took out a patent for 177 acres along the north side of Moorman's River near the town of Fredericksville Parish. Mr. Jamison sold 100 of the 400 acres of this to his son, Samuel Jamison for 40 pounds on March 13, 1765. It was witnessed by Alexander Jimason, Nathan Woods, James Wheary, and Thomas Jamison. This patent was part of an Indenture made November 2, 1748 on a patent of land dated April 12, 1764, between John Jammeson and Parish of St. Ann and John McColloch, party of the second part, a tract of 77 acres in Albemarle co., part of 177 acre tract granted John Jammeson 7/1/1741[7]. It was witnessed by Nathan Woods and James McHaney. In 1765, his son, Samuel Jamison, purchased the land patented in 1756 by Archibald Woods. He later bequeathed it to his son, Alexander, who in 1809 sold it to David Stephenson. Another indenture made June 25, 1747 between himself and James McHaney, party of the second part, for land along branches of Spring Creek in Albemarle. Signed by both Samuel and Jean Jamison and witnessed by John McColloch, John Jameson and Alexander Jameson [7]. Recorded August 13, 1752. On March 13, 1765[7] and on April 12, 1764[6], Mr. Jameson gave a gift of land to sons, Samuel, and Thomas, respectively in Fredericksville Parish. His deed to Samuel Jemason issued March 13, 1765 for 40 pounds on the north side of Moorman's River earlier patented by John Jemason June 1, 1741. Witnesses were: Alexander Jemason, Nathan Woods, James Whearey, and Thomas Jemason. Dated August 12, 1765[7], John Jemason, planter, made an indenture (selling to) with William Elliot on the north side of Moorman's River a tract containing 100 acres. Other important land deeds and documents:

John Jeminson, 400 acres, from James **Blair**, June 1, 1741, Goochland co., VA., north side of Moorman's River [11];

Woods Gap was also known as Turks Gap and Jamisons Gap as Pigeon Top was once earlier called Jameson's Mountain(see map). According to the History of Albemarle County by Rev. Edgar Woods, Jameson came over the Blue Ridge Mountains in 1734 "under the auspices of Michael **Woods**" bringing their Presbyterian faith with them [4]. Others who came at the same time were the Wallaces, Kinkeads, Stocktons, and McCords.

Mr. Jamison served as a Captain in the Virginia militia during the Seven Years War battling the Indians along the Orange co., frontier. *(14) Mr. Jamison made out a deed dated April 12, 1764, Albemarle co., VA., "for and in consideration of the Love Good will & Affection which I have & do bear towards my Loveing Son inLaw Thomas **Craage** of the parrish & county aforesaid.." The tract lay north of Moormans River consisting of 100 acres and everything upon it. Witnesses were: Robert **Miller**, James **Wharey**, and David **Maupin**[7].

The mystery surrounding his wife is one still unsolved and may remain so in the years ahead. None of the land deeds, patented or otherwise, bear any marks of her or her intentions of Dower from 1741 to 1765. While the Bible of Margaret Craig Jamison indicates relationships, it does not exactly state them. If John Jamison was born in 1680, then he was 73 years of age when his last child, Samuel (30435), was born. As mentioned previously, he was 52 when Thomas (30431) was born in 1732. Could Jamison have had two wives? Since one of his children bears the name, Mary, could John Jamison have been the John who married Mary Bell **Wilkerson**? Add to the fact that both Thomas and Samuel Jamison name children John and Mary among their issue. Coincidental?

Mr. Jamison settled in Albemarle county in 1747.*(15) On June 25th, he and wife, Jane, agreed to an indenture with James McHaney on 300 acres on a branch of Spring Creek, patented to Samuel Jameson; witnesses- John McColloch, and John and Alexander Jameson[10]. It's possible that Samuel and his father, John Jamison, followed the Scotch leaders Michael Woods and William Wallace across the Blue Ridge in 1734 and settled into what was then Goochland county, VA. The Mountain Plains Presbyterian Church was built at Mechum's River *(16) and in 1746 the same group built the Rockfish Church in 1747. Those who subscribed a pound annually to the church's coffers were Michael Woods, William Woods, Archibald Woods, William Wallace, Davis Stockton, Samuel Jamison, Joseph Kincaid, and John McCord[16]. *(17) On August 10, 1752, Mr. Jamison and wife, Jean, of the first part, made an indenture with James Wharey, of the second part for the "consideration of forty pounds Current money of Virginia" for a 300 acre tract in Albemarle county on the branches of Spring Creek. This land was bounded by Charles Miller and Samuel Jammerson and granted to Jamison by a patent dated June 25, 1747. Witnesses: John McColloch, John Jamison, Alexander Jameson[12]. In 1755 he purchased 62 acres on the north side of Moorman's River[11]. Five years later he purchased 90 more acres at the same spot[11]. In 1765 he purchased a deed from Archibald Woods at a site called Woods Gap[3] and bordering alonside William Macord's. He also was indentured October 8, 1764 to Archibald and Isabela Woods for a tract at Old Gap on top of Blue Ridge[11]. The land lay on the eastern slopes of the Blue Ridge Mountains and that Wood's Gap was later called Jamison's Gap and finally Turk's Gap. Jamison's Gap laid upon a spur called Jamison's Mountain which later became Pigeon Top. Witnessed by John Dickey, Andrew Leachey, Alexander Jemason, and Andrew Wallace. Mr. Jameson received from his father for forty pounds a tract on the north side of Moorman's River March 13, 1765, a part of a patent sold to John Jamison June 1, 1741[10]. Recorded March of 1765, it was witnessed by Alexander Jameson, Nathan Woods, James McHaney, and Thomas Jameson. In 1776, a Petition was signed by the Albemarle and Amherst dissenters: Thomas Wherry, John Jameson, Samuel Jameson, Thomas Craig, and Thomas Jameson. On August 11, 1785, an indenture between Samuel Jameson and Thomas German was made and witnessed by Maxey Ewell, Samuel Jamison Jr., and William Jameson*(18).

Mr. Jamison's will was dated June 2, 1787 and probated September of 1788[5]. He names sons, Alexander, Thomas, Samuel, and John; sons Alexander and Thomas and Robert **McCulloch**, executors. Jane's will was dated December 4, 1796 and probated in court in June of 1804[9].

<u>"Will of Samuel Jamison"</u>

"In the name of God Amen, I Samuel Jamison of the county of Albemarle and State of Virginia being weak in body but of perfect mind and sound Memory do make this my last Will and testament in manner following first I Committ my Soul to the mercy of God and my Body to the dirt untill the time appointed of god and only Known to him Self & as to my worldlt goods which I hath pleased God to bestow upon me my Will is follow th Viz. First I allow & will that all Just Debts be fully paid I Will & bequeath unto my Dear Wife Jane my Dwelling House and all my household furniture and likewise my two oldest Negroes Viz. Jacob & Sookey & that She dispose of them at her Death as she thinks proper like wise two horses & all my stock of Cattle & hogs to be at her disposal & the use of half the land I live on while she lives I will & bequeath unto my Son Alexander Jamison all that Tract of land he now lives on likewise my Negroe fellow Ivy & a little Negroe boy his pofsifion called David I will & bequeath unto my son Thomas Jamison my Negroe Winch Jean & my cloths & one Book, I will and bequeath unto my son John Jamison one Negroe Winch now in his pofsifion named Lucky & his to him & his heirs forever & likewise a book the Confefsion of faith I will & bequeath unto my youngest son Samuel Jamison the tract of land I now live on to him and his Heirs likewise all the plantation tools likewise the Negroe winch now in his pofsifion Named Betty & her to him & his Heirs likewise one Rifle gun& one shot gun & a colt to his Son William I will and bequeath to my granddaughter Mary Jamison that lives with me a Negroe Child named Anne & her mare & saddle my tracts of land that Absalom **Brown** formerly lived on I allow to be sold and the money to be Equally divided in four parts Viz. Hannah Jamison, Jane Jamison & Elizabeth Jamison daughters of Samuel Jamison and Jane McCord daughter of Alexander Jamison each of them four to have Equal parts in the piece of the aforesaid tract of land I appoint my son Alexander Jamison, my son Samuel Jamison, & Robert McColloch Executors of this my last Will and Testament as In Witness hereunto I Set my hand and affix my Seal this Second day of June one thousand Eigthy Seven. Signed Sealed in presents of us

This last will and testament of Samuel Jamison deceased was produced into Court and proved by the Oaths of William Norris, John Craig, and David Craig Witnesses thereto and or deed to be recorded and probated of the same granted Alexander and Samuel Jamison Executors therein named who gave bond and Security according to Law. Test.

Will of Jane Jamison: Mentions sons Alexander, Thomas, John, and Samuel Jamison; executors: sons Alexander and Samuel Jamison, and nephew, Robert McColloch; signed December 4, 1796; Rec'd in Court June 1804. Jane may have been the daughter of John McColloch of Albemarle co., Va.

Notes:

Mr. Thomas Jamison, planter, had a varied and considerably eventful career as a prominent man of stature within the communities he served and within the political system he advanced. He lacked for nearly nothing: confident, bold, forthright, and splendid on a horse he galloped into history like so few ever did. He was probably born in Pennsylvania or New Jersey, raised in Albemarle county, Virginia, and schooled among the back woods of the Sesquehanna River and Moorman's River.

In one of his earliest militia campaigns under Lt. Col. George Washington the Viginians combined with the English forces under General Edward **Braddock** and met some 900 French and Indian forces eight miles outside Fort Duquesne in the Ohio Territory. On July 9, 1755, the English were totally surrounded by the enemy and were defeated at the Battle of the Wilderness. Braddock was mortally wounded and Washington led the remaining survivors back to Fort Cumberland. This setback drove the English settlers back east across the Monongahela River in Pittsburgh, PA[4]. When Thomas returned to Virginia the drought of 1755 destroyed a good portion of the tobacco crops and everywhere there seem confusion and some despair. Mr. Jamison served during the War of the Rebellion[5,12]. On August 30, 1777 Mr. Jamison signed the Oath of Allegiance[14]. He appears to have spent much of his time supplying the infantry with various food and durable goods and in 1782 he put in a claim for the following items he supplied: 19 pounds of bacon, March of 1781; 21 pounds of bacon, 2 diets *(19), and 2 "sheaves of oates", and 2 bushels of corn.[8] A pension application of Tully Choice states in part "...in the later part of the winter or early part of spring in 1779 the Militia was drafted in classes 1 through 10, and said Choice was drafted in No. 6 and Thomas Jamison in No. 1, in Henry county, Va. William Choice exchanged classes with Thomas Jameson and marched under Capt. Frederick Reeves and his brother Tully Choice."[6] This supports the notion that Thomas at this time didn't enlist as a private *(20) in the Revolution, but preferred to help in other ways. He never applied for a pension stating, "I fought for the liberty of my country, my family and myself, I got it and I am satisfied and I am no beggar."[13] He was remembered for having told some of his grandchildren that he was at the Battle of Guilford Court House, Seige of 96, and at the surrender of General Cornwallis[13].

Thomas Jamison along with Moses Edger and William Pollard witnessed an indenture between John **Chiswell**, Gent., parish of St. Martin, Hanover Co., VA., and Michael **Montgomery**, parish of St. Ann's, Albemarle co., VA., on February 20, 1752 for a tract 500 acres on the South side of Rockfish River. This tract was part of an original tract of 11,145 acres granted to John Chiswell in 1739 at Williamsburg[16]. In 1756 Thomas married the 14 year old daughter of John Dickey, Jane, who was born in Loudon co., VA. Mr. Dickey was from Ireland, born 1703, County Antrim and died 1789, York co., SC., and emigrated around 1740 to the colonies in America[2]. John Dickey's father was George (b.c. 1649, d.c. 1730, a son of William Dickey, b.c. 1615). Martha McNeeley was born 1706 in northern Ireland, the daughter of George McNeely, b.c. 1679, Ireland. Mr. Jamison removed about 1740 to Jackson co., GA. where his first children were born. Some have speculated that Thomas and Jane had a fifth child which caused her death in 1763. No proof has substantiated this claim, yet evidence points to a Joseph Jamison, born January 4, 1763, who is found along the Pigg River in Henry county, Va. as early as 1782. One child he named Jane, but none Thomas. If there is a relationship it may very well be with some other family other than Thomas Jamison. When Mrs. Jamison died in 1763 of bone-break fever[13], tradition cites that Thomas returned to Albemarle county and lived with his brother, Alexander, for some time. No one claims any references for this, though a Virginia deed for Albemarle co., reads: Indenture between John Jemason and Samuel Jemason of Albemarle county, land on north side of Moorman River which was granted to John Jemason June 1, 1741. Signed by John Jameson and witnessed March 13, 1765, by Alexander Jameson, Nathan Woods, James McHaney, and Thomas Jameson[1]. The deed was recorded at March Court of that year. The land in question was that of Thomas' father which he broke up prior to his death and parceled out to his children. One other deed dated April 12, 1764, by his father, John, to Thomas Jamison was a gift of land in Fredericksville Parish, Albemarle county[1]. Others cite this as proof. However, this in fact is the deed to Thomas Craig which John Jamison gave to his son in law in

1764. For some reason S. K. Helms in his book, "The Helm Family of Virginia", 1985, mistakingly writes, "*for the love and good will which I bear to my loving Son, Thomas, of the same place*". This latter deed does not bear upon John's son, Thomas's return to Albemarle co., VA. after his wife's death in 1763. One other document appears to confirm Thomas' visit in Albemarle county was entitled, "A Declaration of Independence Signed by Citizens of Albemarles County, Virginia", April 21, 1779, and was signed by Thomas Jameson, William Shelton, father of Thomas Shelton, who married Mary Jameson, daughter of Thomas, and Thomas Jefferson[13]. Apparently, Mr. Jamison had his main residence in Franklin county, but traveled frequently back and forth between that and Albemarle county. It was perhaps his native home afterall.

When Thomas Jamison and his children removed to Franklin co., Va. is not precisely known. His second wife he married in Albemarle county, which was borne out by the land deed of March 13, 1765, from father, John. He was there in 1765 as stated by a second deed found for him. But in October of 1766, his first daughter, Mary, from his second wife, Hannah, was born in Henry/Franklin co., VA[3]. No one has discovered to this day who Hannah's parents were. What little information there is on her sheds even less light. According to Helm *(21) she emigrated from Ireland.

After their marriage they settled along the Pigg and Snow Rivers in Henry co., Va. which later became a part of Franklin co., VA. The Henry county tax records include Thomas Jamison from $1778(1.7.8)^{*(22)}$, 1779(12.8.4), 1780(3.0.0), 1781/2, 1783(Spencer Clack Distr.), 1784(Ryan & Prunty Distr), Franklin co., VA-1785, 1789, 1792-96[6]. On May 18, 1778, he was appointed an appraiser on the estate of Abner Harbour, deceased[8]. On June 16, of that year, he and Henry Harris were appointed to view a road one(1) mile below Gordons Quarter across from Coles Rd[8]. On July 20, Fred Reeves, Tully Choice Jr., William Jameson, and Thomas Jamison viewed a road from Pigg River where Choices Rd. goes in the road leading from Gordons Quarter to the Courthouse[8]. He was taxed there in 1779-1796[6] on 134 acres of land. On January 20, 1789, Thomas of Franklin co., Va., sold to John **Redd** of Henry Co., 200 acres in the counties of Henry and Franklin on the waters of Reed Creek and the headwaters of Snow Creek the place where John Jamison Jr. now resides. Witnesses: William Stokes, Joshua Dillingham, John Jamison Sr., and John Jamison Jr[7]. On September 23, 1789, Thomas Jamison of Franklin co., VA. sells to John Jamison of Henry co., VA. 350 acres for 100 pounds current money adjoining Harris' line. Signed by Thomas and Hannah Jamison; witnessed by John Norris; Henry Harris; and John Jamison Jr[7]. September 10, 1793 Thomas Jamison of Franklin co., VA. to John Redd of Henry co., VA. for 20 pounds 50 acres on Redd Creek. Witnesses: Joshua Dillingham, Markham Lovell, William Heard, and John Jamison Jr[7]. Later on April 5, 1794, John Redd sold this property to Markham Lovell 150 acres on Reed and Snow Creeks, formerly belonging to Thomas Jamison Sr.; Witnessed: John Jamison Jr[7].

In 1796, Thomas Jamison packed up the whole family, except those who wanted to stay in Franklin co., and removed to Richmond, Madison co. Kentucky[8] and by 1800 had settled in Garrard county, KY[9]. He remained in Kentucky until 1810[10] when he finally settled in Miami, Jefferson co., IN. about 1812[11] where he died[8] and was buried at the Hebron Church cemetery, some miles north of Madison, Jefferson co., IN.

Mr. Jamison was co-executor of his father's will and resided near Wood Gap{Turk's Gap, Jamison's Gap} on a piece of property given him earlier by his father[1]. Mr. Jamison purchased from Samuel **McCord** 10 acres on top of Mountain near McCord's Gap, Albemarle co., Va. on June 1, 1788[3]. Witnesses were John Craig, and Nathan Jameson. On December 18, 1804, Thomas Jameson of Washington co., VA., and wife, Rachel, to George M. **Coiner**, 210 acres, south side of South River, patented to John **Patrick**, September 19, 1793[4]. *(25) Another record shows that Thomas and Rachel Jamison sold September 16, 1793 to Mather **Rhodes**, 40 acres in Albemarle county, originally part of 370 acres patented to Nathan **Woods** on June 25, 1747, at Mechum's River and the Louisa county line[11]. A record states that Thomas Jameson removed from Augusta co., VA., to the North Fork of the Holston(Tennessee) River, whose wife was named Rachel McColloch. Her brother was John McColloch and her sister was Isabel[5]. Mr. Jamison was a sergeant in the Virginia militia[7] and fought during the Revolutionary War. Rachel's father was Lt. Thomas McColloch, born 1735 in Albemarle co., VA. and died October 12, 1780 in Rutherford co., NC. His wife, Isabella **Patrick** was born about 1733 and was still living after 1780 in NC.

Notes:

Mr. Jamison was in his father's and later his mother's will[1]. Mr. Jamison remained in Albemarle co., VA for some time. He was granted 100 acres of land on the north side of Moorman's River in 1755[6], but probably removed to Henry co., VA. about 1784 where he appears in that year's tax list alongside Thomas Jamison(30491), his sons William(30583) and John (30581) in an area of Pigg and Snow Rivers which later became part of Franklin co., VA[2]. Henry Harris is listed as early as June 16, 1778 (Mr. Harris was appointed with Thomas Jamison to view a road one mile below Gordons Quarter across Coles Rd[4]) and 1779 in Henry co., VA[3]. Henry Harris was a witness to a land deed dated September 23, 1789 for Thomas and Hannah Jamison of Franklin co., VA. in which Thomas sells to John Jamison of Henry co., 350 acres for 100 pounds which adjoins Harris' line on an unnamed creek(Ready) [3]. So John Jamison migrated to Henry co., probably his sister, Jean, coming with him (she married Ruffin **Brown** in Franklin co., VA., in 1794) settling possibly in with one of his relatives until he married Henry's daughter, Elizabeth in 1788-90. He was a witness to a deed between James **Young** to Samuel **Dent** August 9, 1787, land situated on Reedy Creek, a branch off Snow Creek[3]. By March 10, 1795 Henry Harris sold to William **Warren** 333 acres on Ready Creek; John Jamerson, witness[3]. This was about the time that John Jamerson/Jamison removed from the area and settled in Madison co., KY.

Notes:

Mr. Jamison, 1788, inherited the old farm in Fredericksville Parish, Albemarle co., VA. along with some tools, livestock, and slaves[3]. On March 16, 1793, he was a witness for William **Jerman** vs. Robert **McCullock** and the court order Jerman to pay him 75 pounds of tobacco for 3 days attendance[1]. Reconvening in May of that year the court again ordered Jerman to pay both Samuel and his brother, Thomas, Jamison 50 pounds of tobacco for two days attendance[1]. On September 11, 1794, an indenture of "bargain and sale" between Samuel Jameson, acting on his father's behalf, and Henry Houk was produced in court and ordered recorded[1,4] on a 153 acre tract of land lying beside Moorman's River. Mr. Jamison was in the Revolutionary War having served as a private[11] in several "tours of duty in the Virginia Militia". He

served under a number of men among whom were Captains John **Miller** and John **Harris**. His wife applied for the pension October 22, 1842, Albemarle co.,VA.

In 1805 Mr. Jameson died and his will was probated shortly afterwards. Margaret Jameson and William Maupin, her son-in-law, administrators of Samuel's estate went to court against David Wood for debts due the estate[1]. On May 7, 1807 the Jury found in favor of Margaret Jameson and Wood was ordered to clear up his debt[1]. In the years to come the Woods played out a scenario against others of the Jameson family, though for what purpose has not been discovered since the families had known each other since the early 1740s. Land disputes and court battles over inheritances were common and thus this may have been one such episode among many. The inventory of his estate was handled by his widow, Margaret, June 3, 1805 and received into court October 7[3]. Inventory and appraisal of his estate occurred again December 26, 1810, with Matthew Rodes, James Harris, and Joel Harris as witnesses[3]. The Book of Settlements of the Estate Records of Albemarle county mentions the following: Jane Maupin, Hannah Harris, Cathy Mills, Polly Birckhead, William Jameson, and Samuel's wife, Margaret Jameson. Administrations of Accounts and Divisions mentions: Margaret Jameson, Hannah Maupin, Jane Maupin, Elizabeth Harris, Cathy Mills, Polly Birckhead, William Jameson, Samuel Jameson, John Jameson, Robert Jameson, and Alexander Jameson. And again June 1, 1812, William Maupin and Margaret Jameson as administrators[3]. Margaret Jameson gave power of attorney to Tilman J. Maupin, December 23, 1844, witnessed by William R. Maupin, D. M. Jarman, and M. B. Jarman^[4]. On June 10, 1845, she allowed her son, Samuel Jameson, to have power of attorney[4]. The last estate inventory occurred August 6, 1849 and signed by Deebria M. Jameson, M. B. Jameson, and Joshua W. Cabell[3].

Margaret Jameson died in April of 1850, at the age of 97 years. Her will was dated June 10, 1849 and probated June 3, 1850[3]. She mentions heirs: grandsons William L. F. Jameson, Walter Jameson; Rebeckah Jameson, wife of Samuel Jameson; son Samuel Jameson 1/6th part of remainder of estate; daughter Hannah Jameson Maupin 1/6 th part of remainder; daughter Catharine Mills 1/6 th part; daughter Mary Birkhead 1/6th part; children of William and Jane Jameson Maupin 1/6th part; children of James "Wiley" and Elizabeth Jameson Harris 1/6th part; Executor, son, Samuel Jameson; Witnesses: _____ Brown; Thomas Clark; and Thomas Thurston; codicil: excluded sons William Jameson and John Jameson and children of Alexander Jameson as they received their shares during her lifetime. Estate inventory was concluded October 7, 1850 by Samuel and William Jameson; list of property sold by administrator at public auction[3], September 2, 1850; estate account February 10, 1852 by Samuel Jameson[3].

Thomas J. Maupin was listed in Margaret Craig Jamison's Bible Records. His children as listed were: Samantha Ann, born September 14, 1830; Cynthia Ann, born November 11, 1832; Mary Linda{Lidna, Sidna}, born May 30, 1835; and William Bernard, born August 18, 1837. How these people are related is notknown presently[12].

30580-5 SAMUEL JAMISON [Thomas, John, James, Alexander], was born 1757, Jackson co., GA. the son of Thomas and Jane (Dickey) Jamison (30432). Mr. Jamison, in all likelihood, probably removed to Tennessee or Kentucky.

Notes:

Between 1770 to 1790 history swirled with the magnitude of great things taking place, and the men caught up in them were further testimony of the on-going difficulties that confronted our nation. Samuel(30580) and John(30581) Jamison, sons of Thomas and Jane (Dickey) Jamison, were enduring frontiersmen who felt the rush and push of people at their backs along the Blue Ridge Mountains. Like most of the Over-Mountain men the Jamisons were strong Scotsmen who had migrated south from New England and Pennsylvania forming an affinity with the wild untapped lands and isolation it created. While a transplanted lot, these men were argumentive, visionary, and quick-tempered. They hated the British and the interference that created havoc with their agricultural economy.

Research has shown that several of the Jamison clan and related families became a part of the Holston Settlements that populated the present day states of western North Carolina and Virginia and the eastern wedge of Tennessee. Thomas and Rachel Jamison (30571) removed into the backwater settlements of Virginia just north of the confluence of the Holston and Watauga Rivers. John and Samuel Jamison resided in nearby Henry and Franklin co., Va. and were actively involved in the formation of the Watauga Association, which became the vehicle for the formation of the state of Franklin. The wife of John Jamison Jr., Catherine, first cousin to Daniel **Boone**, without whom would not exist the Wilderness Trail which he so historically blazed along the Virginian-North Carolina border west to the Cumberland Gap and so into Kentucky. And there were others from this family who catapulted the southern expansion into a rout for opportunity and free land for the taking in the west.

Yet there were difficulties to surmount. The entire region was inhabited by Americans who had settled these vast wildernesses long before the English even knew there was a North American continent: Catawbas, Cheraws, Shawnees, Chicamaugas, especially the Cherokees, who, while friendly at first, came to realize that ceding their lands to the settlers only made the foreigners hungry for more; and inevitably friend became foe. Other factors made settlement a hazard. The French during the French and Indian War penetrated into Alabama building forts and making alliances, inciting the Creeks and Shawnee, and wending their way into the lands later to be called Tennessee. The British, in a bid to protect their advancing front, allied themselves with the Cherokees, permeating their entire culture through economics. After a while even these proud men realized "they could not live without the traders." *(26) Expansion from the sea coast and leap-frogging migrations created heavier burdens on the western country and so needed that which it lacked-organization and protection. The 1763 proclamation line had been overrun by the invading Scotch-Irish and German-Monrovian spread of civilization into the wild. In 1768, a group of men from Orange and Mecklenburg counties, North Carolina formed a loose group called the Regulators, insurrectionists who fought tooth and nail against the Royal authority. Refusing to pay their taxes resulted in acts of violence by the British which enraged the local colonial instigators into a riot. Governor **Tyron** showed no sympathy, instead standing aside while 700 colonials retreated from Crown troops. With their following so strong the colonial leaders took over the normally influenced Crown assembly, but the Governor dissolved that body and placed the territory on alert. At the Battle of Alamance in May of 1771 Tyron with 1200 troops crushed the Regulators severely, executing James Few, the leader, on the spot. Some of those involved at Alamance who also scattered over the Blue Ridge to reach the Watauga Settlements on the Holston were the Armstrongs, Fergusons, and

Jamesons(# 40900), who came from Augusta co., VA. to help defend their liberties and rights. Additionally, the Crown was hard-pressed to stop their own excesses. Certainly, taxation without representation, which was proclaimed even then in 1771 at Alamance embattled the mother nation, bottling the profits of its colonies resulting in boycotts and other instigations to release the pressure that continued to build.

These were the events that bore down upon the settlements of the Holston and Watauga. These were times of ripening and of open clashes; one of revolution on the broad front, and one of separation and independence and adulthood. Each sought out the same things no matter the yardstick from which they were judged. And while the Watauga Association failed to become the state of Franklin, it help precipitated the young colonial America into the nation we know today.

In 1769, the first white man settled upon the Watauga River. At William Bean's door knocked some of the great men of the age-John **Sevier**, Daniel Boone, James **Robertson**, Arthur **Campbell**, and Isaac **Shelby**. For the next sixteen years the region would swell in population to nearly 30,000 * (27) by 1787. The Watauga-Holston people were pioneers in the truest sense of the word. They saw in their isolation a need for community organization and defense, and accordingly, in the spring of 1772, formed the Watauga Association. They promulgated the Articles of the Watauga Association, the first written American-born constitution adopted by a community exercising the rights and privileges of self-government. It is not known if any of the Jamesons who were here signed this document for no copy exists to this author's knowledge. It is clear that the settlements threw themselves into the formation of a new state from that moment on and Samuel and John Jamison became a part of this activity.

In the years to come this fledgling community in spirit and action were present at most of all the important events of the times. In 1774 they sent out a volunteer force of fifty men under Captain Evan **Shelby** to confront the Shawnee at the Battle of Point Pleasant situated at the junction of the Ohio and Kanawha Rivers, about 45 miles northwest of Charleston, WV. The confrontation represented the culmination of Lord Dunmore's War against the Indian reprisals against the continual English encroachment beyond the 1763 proclamation line. In 1775 Richard **Henderson** representing the Transylvania Company, a coalition of North Carolina land speculators, purchased from the Overhill Cherokees most of Kentucky and the Cumberland tracts in Tennessee. The treaty was conducted at Sycamore Shoals on March 17 at Holston, while twenty miles away, Daniel Boone was hacking his way to the Cumberland Gap.

When the American Revolution fired its first volley, the Cherokees erringly decided to ally with the British in its fight against the colonists. It was a fatal decision. In a series of attacks in 1776, the Indians drove the settlers inside their stout forts. With the entire Nation on the warpath and the Tories attacking along the southern foothills of South Carolina, the Wataugans were hard pressed in their battles. The rage in the southern colonies over the Indian offense rallied up several contingents of volunteers from Georgia, the Carolinas, and Virginia with but one thought-to punish the Indians for their perfidy before the real fight began with England. With nearly 7000 men raised, 2000 alone from the Holston River area, the leaders drove their men through the French Broad River country defeating the Indians in their own back yard. By the end of the year the Cherokees had sued for peace and the entire region had now come under the North Carolina authority.

In 1780 a dark cloud hung over the entire southern colonies, some five years after the opening shot at Concord Bridge. It was the year the British took Savannah and Charleston, when General Cornwallis had the region tight in the palm of his hand, while Ferguson and Tarleton, his aides were raiding through the Yadkin Valley toward King's Mountain, North Carolina. Here Col. Ferguson sent an emissary to John Sevier, now camped at Sycamore Shoals, to submit to George II or face the consequences. Without the full knowledge of American army headquarters, nor an established, single military officer among them, or any regular troops to help, the clans at Watauga rose up as one, and under the leadership of Col. William **Campbell** and Indian fighter, John Sevier, they marched south. A week later on October 7, 1780 Campbell led his men in a charge

against Ferguson at King's Mountain. In an hour and a half of fierce fighting, Ferguson lay dead, his 1125 fighting redcoats either dead, wounded, or captured. Not a man escaped, and while the hangings began, Sevier raced back to Sycamore Shoals, aiding James Robertson in his battle against the Cherokee fugitives of 1776, who had regrouped at Chattanooga under Dragging Canoe in retaliation of their defeat.

John Sevier was the key to Franklin as Jefferson was to Independence. Of French Huguenot extraction he was Virginian by birth, born 1745 in Shenandoah. Educated at Fredericksburg, he rose quickly to prominence, and by 1772 was settled along the Holston at the future site of Jonesboro, TN. In January of 1782, Col. Arthur Campbell, born 1742 in Augusta co., VA., along with John Jamison circulated a document among the Holston Settlements in a "Scheme for Obtaining the Sense of the Inhabitants of the Western Country on the Subject of the Late Resolves of Congress", which concerned the sovereignty of the United States authority over the Carolina territory of the settlements on the Holston-Watauga Rivers. It was the germ of an idea and it snowballed into a real cry for the establishment of a state along the western frontier. While it stirred up hostile controversy and opposition in Virginia, Campbell was joined by John Jamison, William Cocke, John Sevier, and now General William Russell, veteran of the F & I War, who later married Campbell's widow, Elizabeth, a sister of the Governor of Virginia, Patrick Henry.

The earliest Campbell plan called for the new state to include five of Virginia's western counties. In 1783, however, Thomas Jefferson, influenced to some degree by his friend Thomas Jamison since Jamison's sons were involved with Campbell, reported that Patrick Henry was ready to restrict Virginia to certain bounds by lopping off the furthermost territories and making them self-regulating republics. In that year, too, Kentucky had renewed its interests in becoming independent. Campbell, a devout separationist, had been the driving force behind that campaign which fitted neatly with his over all plans for the territory. But the men on the frontier did not reckon the Avery Treaty of 1777, which fixed the Cherokee proclamation line only 20 miles south of Jonesboro forcing some of the best of the new migrants to head west into the Cumberland Valley rather than south toward the Great Bend, a fertile region along the Tennessee River.

But expansion of the frontier moved incessantly forward as difficulties among Georgia, North Carolina, and South Carolina, rival claimants in the Allegheny land grab, heated up. While Virginia pursued legal claims to the frontier beyond the Blue Ridge, North Carolina aggressively maintained its influence but not its protection in the western country. With the cross rivalries that existed, the Cession Acts in the spring of 1784 brought control of the Western Country under the Congress of the United States. It and the Ordiance of 1784 encouraged the frontier to form separate governments, and on August 23rd the first constitutional convention was called and held at Jonesboro to do just that. John Sevier was elected president of the assembly and declared among other things to establish a new state for the territory.

John Jamison was in Washington county around Christmas late in 1784, for his name appears on a document drawn up by Arthur Campbell titled, "Memorial to the Honorable Congress of the United States" and signed by the following men: John **Kincaid** *⁽²⁸⁾, Arthur Campbell, Thomas **Woolsey**, John Campbell, Senator of VA, Richard **Brownlow**, John **Davis**, Charles **Cummins**, Chairman, Robert **Buchanan**, John Campbell(not a double entry), Alexander **Wiley**, William **Tate**, George **Finley**, Matthew **Willoughby**, Gilbert **Christian**, John **Anderson**, David **Looney**, John **Adair**, and John Jamison. Besides indicating their legal attempts for statehood the brief also produced a general mapping of the territory under consideration. While no actual borders were ever surveyed, the area was outlined in the document as beginning by the Little Tennessee River on the south, hence east and bounding on North Carolina, hence west along the 37th parallel to the Clinch River and southwesterly to the bounds first mentioned. This included many of the backwater settlements of Virginia, some of the western portion of North Carolina, and parts of present day Tennessee. North Carolina, upset by Sevier and Campbell's bid to put Franklin on the map, pulled the Cession Acts in the spring of '84 determined to bring the frontiersman under a new state named by Carolina as West Carolina. Failing in this they allowed the Holston-Watauga settlements to govern independently appointing David **Campbell** as an Assistant Judge and Seveir as Brigadier General of the Militia. Their intention to reduce the influence either

man held in forming a new state. The ploy failed for a 2nd Constitutional Convention was held at Jonesboro which the leaders called for a vote to make the territory completely independent of Carolina. They elected John Sevier, Governor, and named the new state, Franklin, after the renoun statesman, Benjamin **Franklin**. Following closely on the heels of this enactment, in 1785 a petition proposed modifications in the rigid boundaries adopted by Thomas **Jefferson** in the Ordinance of 1784. Campbell sent <u>Jamison</u> back to Jefferson to iron out the differences, and failed, the singular result a change in the borders of the "State to the South..." which newly included the inhabitants at the headwaters of the Kanawha and Tennessee Rivers, but knocked out the northern Virginian counties by setting the boundary line as a continuation of the VA-NC border west into the wilderness. Arthur Campbell caused no little stir over this, had John Jamison sent north to influence his father's old friends, and made a nuisance of himself at the Virginian capital. When Governor Henry issued a warning to the people of the Holston, Campbell desisted, yet Henry saw no reason why Kentucky, as the territory was now called, couldn't be self-governing.

During the following March the convention again came to order and ratified several acts: establishment of North Carolina land claims; appointments of commissioners with full powers; establishment of a militia; division of Sullivan and Greene counties; the creation of a new county called Spencer; method of electing members of the General Assembly; design of a state seal; and chores normally responsible by any acting authority moving toward statehood. William **Cocke**, formerly a Captain in the militia, was also formerly appointed representative to Congress.

Yet North Carolina wasn't done with this affair, nor sit on any sidelines waiting to see what the outcome would be. Governor Alexander **Martin**, who succeeded Tyron, issued his own "Manifesto" on April 5th, 1785, sternly warning the inhabitants of Franklin to return their allegiance to Carolina. Sevier rebutted this with his "A Proclamation" in reply citing retaliatory action if the Carolina cause was consummated. When Martin was succeeded by Richard **Caswell** as Governor in the spring of '85, the entire debate was sent to New York for a decision by Congress.

William Cocke took his state's mandate to Congress on May 5, and that August body immediately formed a committee to examine the cessation act of North Carolina. Under the rules of the Articles of Confederation, the repeal of the Cessation Act by NC was an unlawful attempt by that state to repeal a Congressional Act. Round One went to Sevier. No single state had this authority and while Cocke had engineered a masterful victory against North Carolina, he did not, unfortunately, press his state's demand for entry under the Articles. With Congress clearly on their side, this lapse in judgment or consideration caused them dearly. Jefferson, on the other hand, felt this victory would effect a successful conclusion to the Franklin issue toward statehood. Had the people of Jonesboro been astute to have named their territory Jefferson, instead, history might have been rewritten. North Carolina had created an unfavorable position for themselves in overriding a Congressional act and all the cards had been put into Cocke's capable hands. Even nationally, the Franklin revolt against Carolina was seen much the same as the recent revolution against Britain. Jefferson even admitted that, "an occasional rebellion" be encouraged. In literal response the Jonesboro assembly in the fall passed that an expedition be sent to the Great Bend for possession of and to take title to the Cumberland Valley claimed by the state of Georgia. The Watauga Association was on a roll.

In November of 1785 the Treaty of Hopewell in South Carolina gave Congress for the first time the authority and power to act in regard to the Indian situation as a national crisis rather than a state mandated policy. By extending the territory for the Cherokees it contracted the Franklin borders. The severity of this was shown when after the lines were drawn, Greenville was placed within the confines of the Cherokee nation, only a few days after it was chosen as the new capital of the new tentative state. Migration spread its thrust a sharp wedge southwesterly and deep into the Indian lands all the way to Nolichunky and Tennessee River valleys. Because Martin and Hawkins were North Carolinians and commissioners at Hopewell, the men at Jonesboro were probably right in their assessment that they had been swindled out of the land in a punitive act so North Carolina could be compensated for the loss of territory. All along the frontier the treaty was denounced, and Congress had been urged not to enact it. On April 16, 1786, the Treaty was ratified.

That March Jonesboro, resolute despite the Hopewell treaty, enacted coinage and took steps to protect themselves to the south. During the spring the Indians opened hostilities against the settlements that dotted the territory, and John Sevier raised an armed force to contend with it. He also sent Cocke back to New York to continue influence peddling their need to become a state. Throughout 1786 Georgia and Franklin continued their attacks against the uprisings. North Carolina also continued its efforts to legally hold onto Franklin.

The Indian situation finally fanned out in early 1787, but created alarm throughout the middle colonies for some time. Carolina battled Sevier and Cocke at every corner, eventually turning the tide of favor toward their own policies. In March a truce between Franklin and Carolina was arranged and stayed in place until November. By May Caswell had complained that Jonesboro was not complying with the agreements of the treaty and by December a "Petition of the Inhabitants of the Western Country" was written, signed, and submitted to the North Carolina legislature for the purpose to remain independent and self-governing. Besides Samuel and John Jamison, Andrew Jackson, and Joseph McMinn, 450 others penned their names to this document.

Yet the advance to statehood by 1788 faded and Sevier, no longer confident, advocated joining forces with their old enemies. By summer the state was 'defunct' and Sevier discredited in a later scheme in fostering the hope of statehood with the Spanish further out on the frontier. By January of 1789, the Articles of Association signed by Franklinites enacted the laws and constitution of North Carolina when friendlier voices in Congress were no more. North Carolina retained control of the old frontier until the territory was given statehood in 1796 as Tennessee.

Of the men who strove to etch out a state from raw resources, each went on to something else. John Sevier was elected the first Governor of Tennessee and served three consecutive terms. Arthur Campbell spent the next 35 years of his life fostering the spirit of statehood. William Cocke became a Congressman from Tennessee for 12 years serving, too during the War of 1812, and dying in 1829, one of this nation's greatest orators. John Jamison returned to Franklin co., VA. where he spent the remainder of his life on his large plantation and involved himself heavily in Virginian affairs. Samuel Jamison's history is unknown. After Franklin's demise he returned to Virginia, but no records have unearth any segment of his future life and times, fading as the late great state of Franklin into obscurity.

Notes:

Mr. Jamison was a Revolutionary War Veteran[1]. He was born in Jackson co., GA(unconfirmed) and removed with his father to Albemarle co., Va., when his mother died in 1763. Here he grew up in the back woods along the Blue Ridge for a number of years before resettling in Henry/Franklin cos., VA. At manhood Mr. Jamison married about 1778, poss. in Henry County, Va., to Ellen _____[2,3]. On September 23, 1789, Thomas and Hannah Jamison of Franklin co., VA. sold to John Jamison Sr., of Henry co., VA., a 350 acre tract for 100 pounds old money which joined **Harris**' line on an unnamed creek(prob. Reed Creek)[4]. Witnesses were: John **Norris**, Henry **Harris**, and John Jamison Jr. Two years later John Jamison Sr., and John **Reed** sell to John Norris 60 acres of which 4 or 5 acres belonged to Reed{Reid} at the upper end of the track. On March 20, 1794, Henry co., Va. Jamison's tract was originally patented to John Reed who sold it to Nathan **Norris**. On April 19, 1797, John Norris, John Jamison Sr., and Markham **Lowell** sell to Clement **Murphy** 90 acres on Reed Creek in three separate tracts[4].

Mr. Jamison died intestate in 1824*⁽²⁹⁾ according to a lawsuit disposition filed in that year by Samuel Jamison & Others versus Ridley, Beverly **Ridley**, & Samuel **Patton** in a debt against Marshall Jamison(guardian of Elizabeth Jamison), Samuel Jamison, Bartly Bird, and wife Jane Jamison Bird, John Jamison Jr., Thomas Jamison, Drury **Warren**, and Sally Jamison Warren, his wife, Robert **Newsom**, and Hessey Jamison Newsom, his wife, and Ruffin **Brown** (guardian of James, Wiley, Samuel, Brown, and Jane Jamison, orphans of William Jamison(30583)). The petition states that John Jamison was appointed Administrator of his father's estate. The following children were named in the papers: Marshall, John, Thomas, Samuel, Elizabeth, Jane Byrd, Sally Warren, Hessey Newsom along with orphans of William Jamison, deceased: Wiley, Brown, Peggy, Sally, and Jane Jamison. William Jamison also died intestate. John Jamison left the following negores: Jacoby; Dice & her infant child; Betsy & her children-Jane & Charles; Rachel; and Suckey. Mr. Jamison and his brother, William Jamison, appeared to have stake some land in Tennessee, but their deaths appear to have been in Franklin co., VA.

Notes:

John McWilliams came out of northern Ireland prior to 1734 and settled in Culpeper county, VA. Hugh and Mary McWilliams were the parents of the following children: John, James, David, Elizabeth, Sarah, and Jane. Elizabeth married William Jamison(30583). James McWilliams, residing in Orange co., NC., served for three months in the American Revolution at the age of 16 under the command of Captain **McDonald**, attached to Colonel **Butler**'s North Carolina Regiment. Stationed at Cross Creek he was primarily responsible for guarding the barracks.

Discharged later in 1778 Mr. McWilliams moved to Henry co., Va. where he married Martha Jamison. In the summer of 1781, he re-enlisted and served three more months under the command of Captain Thomas **Doggard** in Colonel **Tucker**'s VA. Regiment under General Robert **Lawson**. Marched to Prince Edward Courthouse his division was joined under the command of General Marquis de **Lafayette** July 4, 1781. The army pursued Lord Conwallis's troops west along the James River to York and later to Old Jamestown. He was discharged just before the surrender of Cornwallis.

James and Martha McWilliams left Henry county, VA. in 1793/4 for Kentucky and settled eventually in

Hardin County at the mouth of Valley Creek on the Nolin River. He removed from this tract shortly afterwards and resettled at the confluence of Cedar and Mill Creeks. Mr. McWilliams was prominent citizen of Hardin county. For years he was a Justice of the Peace and obtained his pension as a veteran of the armed forces.

George W. Smith was born October 10, 1786, Charlottesville, Albemarle co., VA. He and Hannah were the parents of James, Sallie, David, George W. Jr., and Elizabeth. G. W. Smith Jr. and Hannah **Ashcraft** were the parents of five children.

Ist, As to Hannah Smith Elizabeth Ashcraft Sarah Viers Martha Wilson and Ann Williams all of which I have proportioned of each their equal shares to hold for there use except the aforesaid Martha Wilson which I will and bequeath a negro girl as the value of the portion which girl is named Dorca ______ and which negro girl at the death of my daughter I will and bequeath the aforesaid negro girl and her increase if any to Mahala Wilson, daughter of Martha Wilson.

2nd, I will and bequeath to six of my grandchildren vis- Polly Bailey, _____ Emery, Samuel Emery, William Emery, Elizabeth Emery, Patsy Williams, the heirs of sixty dollars of which sum will be equally divided among them but the appointed Patsy Williams has received a horse of which _____ her portion _____ the other five to have the above mentioned sixty dollars.

3rd, I now will and bequeath all the balance of my estate to my son James ______ negroes and all personal estate for which he is to pay Polly Morrison four hundred dollars it being her full portion of my estate.

Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my son James McWilliams my true and lawful executor to this my last Will and Testament not doubting but he will fully cause into effect this my last will.
