

WILLIAM JIMMERSON OF UPSON COUNTY, GEORGIA

NOTES

At the onset of discovery there were two brothers, or two cousins, or a father and a son residing in Upson county, Georgia. How Providence and William Jimmerson were related is not known, though surely one existed. The lack of additional information on Providence suggests that either he died or moved elsewhere and the very tenuous and vague roots of Mrs. Nancy Jimmerson provide some clue to the family's origins.

43210-1 PROVIDENCE JIMMERSON, resided in Upson county, Georgia in 1830. No other details have come to light.

43211-1 WILLIAM JIMMERSON[8], b.c. 1772/3, Georgia, d.c. 1858, Upson county, GA. He married about 1808/09 in Upson county to Nancy[2,6], who was born around 1787/88 in South Carolina and died afer 1860.

Mr. Jimmerson was a farmer born in Georgia. Listed as early as 1830 in Upson co.[1], the 1850 census shows[2]:

William Jimmerson, age 77, farmer, b. GA.

Nancy, age 62, b. SC.

Nancy, age 21, b. GA.

McDonald, age 14, b. GA.

Chistopher Smith, age 17, laborer.

Mr. Jimmerson's will was dated January 6, 1851 and probated on October 7, 1858[3]. In it he mentions wife, Nancy, daughters-Nancy Barksdale, Elizabeth Horn, Rachael Stilwell, Prissa Smith, & Rosaner Quick; sons-McDonald, Thomas, John, William, Robert, Job, and Lear. Witnesses were: Augustus A. **Smith**, Leroy W. **Ellington**, and J. G. **Starling**[3].

Some confusion abounds over a record showing that Rosanner Jimmerson married a Caleb Smith on November 16, 1837[4,6], yet her father's will states his daughter as Rosaner Quick in 1851. Another record states that Rosannah of District 494 was a widow in 1827[8] and had drawn lands in the 1827 lottery in another county[7]. There must have been two Rosannah Jimmersons in the area, though no records show anything more on the one who married Caleb Smith in 1837. Was this a mistake in the records from which this came? Certainly Priscilla Smith was still alive in 1851 ruling out an early death for her prior to 1837.

The surname varied greatly in the records: Jimerson, Jimmerson, Jameson, and Jamerson, though Jimmerson was used more frequently than the others. Important to note here is that several of the Jemisons out of Twiggs county, GA. who resided in Upson county also had their surnames spelt Jimmerson*(1). Was this, then, a reflection of the census taker's inaccuracies? Two of William Jimmerson's sons, McDonald and John, must have prounounced their last name as Jamerson for that is how it was written in the census[2], while another son, William, had it written, Jameson.

Of note also is the inclusion of a Priscilla Jimerson, age 55, b. in North Carolina listed in the household of James Jimerson, age 81, farmer, b. SC in the 1860 Marion co., Ga. census[5]. This county was next door to Upson. Any connections??

Mrs. Jimmerson was born in South Carolina[2] and interestingly enough there were a group of Jamesons who

settled in Fulton co., Georgia some forty miles north of Upson county who also came out of South Carolina. Their paternal ancestor was William Jameson(19200), who with a brother, left Orange co., Virginia and settled in Easley, Pickins co., SC. It is unknown where the brother moved on to, maybe even Georgia.

43230-2 THOMAS JIMMERSON [William][2], b.c. 1809/10, Upson co., GA[2], was the son and first child of William and Nancy Jimmerson(43211). He married Sarah[2]*⁽²⁾ (Stillwell?), born 1809/10 in North Carolina[6]. They resided in Upson co., Georgia[1,2,7].

43234-2 JOHN JIMMERSON [William][1], was born about 1817/18 Upson county, Ga., the son and fifth child of William and Nancy Jimmerson(43211). He married October 12, 1840, in Upson co., Georgia Elizabeth R. **Bridges**[2,4], born circa 1831/32 in GA. where they resided.

43239-2 NANCY LEAH JIMMERSON [William][2], was born 1828/29, Upson co., GA., the daughter and tenth child of William and Nancy Jimmerson(43211). She died January 4, 1910, Worth co., GA. Miss Jimmerson married first, March 24, 1850, Upson co., GA. to James **Barksdale**[3]. She married second, circa 1869, James F. **Perdue**, born 1814, in Jefferson co., GA.
